## BILLY SUNDAY EXPLAINS GREAT BIBLE MYSTERY

May Have Been 11,970 People in the World When Cain, 128 Years Old, Went to the Land of Nod.

Billy Sunday does not simply talk in his sermons. He reasons carefully and Methodically. Probably no more interesting example of his theological reasoning occurs in his sermons than when he explains how Cain got a wife. If you will study your scriptural chronology carefully, you will find that when Cain went out to court his wife he was a lusty youth 128 years old.

"Josephus says that Nod means 'vagabond' or 'vagabondage,' the 'ground that God has cursed.' Allowing that there were seven pairs on earth at the end of the first twelve years, and that population will double in 25 years, and that Cain was 128 years old when he knew his wife—that would have made the then known population of the world 11,970.

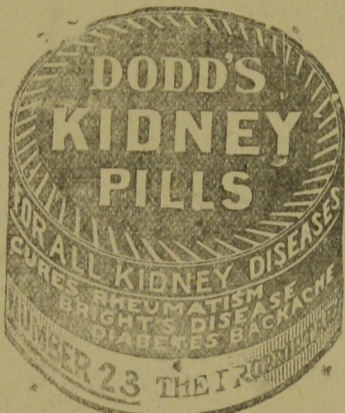

#### Temperance Sunday.

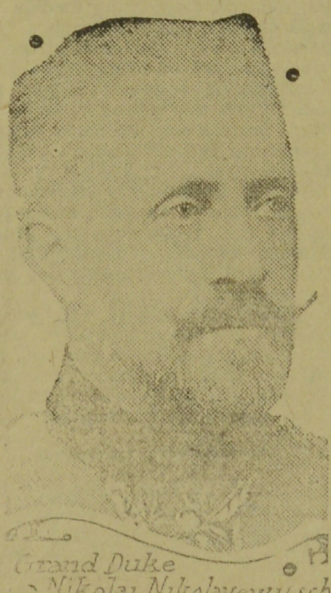
Yesterday was observed all over the American continent as Temperance Sunday in the churches. In this city able discourses were delivered on the subject from a number of pulpits.
