#### SAYS RUSSIANS HAD HEAVY LOSSES

Berlin, July 19.—The Russians have been strongly reinforced along the front south and southwest of Riga, at the northern end of the Russian line, and have been heavily attacking Field Marshal Von Hindenburg's forces there, the War Office announced today.

The assaults, however, all failed, the Russians suffering unusually severe losses.

#### GREAT PITCHING FEAT.

One of the most unusual pitching feats of the season, one as rare as a hitless game, was performed at the Polo grounds yesterday by Bob Shawkey.

Fanning the entire side in one inning is not unusual, but the way Shawkey did the trick in the eighth inning is most unusual. He retired Smith, Gandil and Chapman in succession and each took three swings at the ball.

There was not a called strike nor a foul, other than light foul tips, during the inning. Each took three elusory swings at the ball and every pitch settled in Al Walter's glove.

Writers who had been looking at baseball games for years could remember no such performance by another pitcher.

Usually foul strikes and called strikes play a part in retiring the side at the plate. In this case every strike was a missed swing.

#### ANOTHER CREDIT VOTE TO BE ASKED FOR

London, July 19.—Another vote of credit will be asked of the House of Commons next week, the Premier informed the House today.

It will be the eleventh vote since the outbreak of the war, and probably will be for £300,000,000, the same amount as the last one. This will bring up the total for the war to £2,862,000,000.






