

Washington, May 26-The United States, denouncing interference with neutral mails, has notified Great Britain and France that it can no ess practice" those governments of court today. have indulged in, and that only a radical change in policy, restoring the United States to its full rights s a neutral power, will be satisfac-

This notification is given in the GOOD PLAYING BY the two governments, the text of which was made public by the state department tonight. The time in which the change must be effected is not specified, but the United States expects prompt action.

"Onerous and vexatious" abuses which have been perpetrated by the British and French governments in seizing and censoring neutral mails are recited in the communication, and answers are made to the legal arguments contained in the reply of the Enterite governments to the first American note on the subject. It is vigorously set forth that not only have American commercial interests been injured, but that the rights of property have been violated, and the rules of international law and custom palpably disregarded. Notice is served that the United States oon will press claims against the British and French governments for the losses which already have be sustained.


