## ANGLO-FRENCH FORCES

For many months he made no real progress in the east, despite his enormous losses, far greater in proportion to his resources than those of the British on the Somme. But to hold him the South abandoned its resistance to Sherman, and ultimately lost the war.

### Russians Capture a Village.

Petrograd, Aug. 4.—Russian troops have captured the village of Rudka-Mirynskaia, on the River Stavok, a left tributary of the Stokhod, it was officially announced today by the Russian War Department. Rudka-Mirynskaia is 19 miles east of Kovel.

### German Official Report.

Berlin, Aug. 4. (via London).—Austro-German troops have regained all the territory which they had lost in the region of Rudka-Mirynskaia, according to the official statement issued today by the German army headquarters. The Teutons also gained ground in the Carpathian mountains, in the region of Kopilas.

## ANNIVERSARY OF WAR DECLARATION OBSERVED

The second anniversary of the declaration of war between Britain and Germany was fittingly observed in Fredericton today. This morning special services of intercession were held at Christchurch Cathedral and at St. Dunstan's church. At the Cathedral Very Rev. Dean Neales preached an eloquent sermon. Rev. Father Carney conducted the service at St. Dunstan's church.

This afternoon a public meeting is being held at the City Opera House. At this meeting the resolution of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor is to be passed. There is also to be a discussion on the matter of increasing contributions to the Patriotic Fund in York and Sanbury counties and the city of Fredericton.

## HAS BLACKLISTED AMERICAN FIRMS

Melbourne, via London, Aug. 4.—The Commonwealth has issued a blacklist of American firms. Trading with these firms is prohibited.

### Operation at Newcastle.

Newcastle Advocate: Mr. Cecil White, of Stanley, was operated on in the Miramichi Hospital, Friday, by Dr. Moore, assisted by Drs. Nicholson and Desmond. In the same hospital recently there have been three operations for appendicitis—Geo. Salome, Newcastle; Mrs. Bert Hovey, Ludlow; and Johnnie Young, aged 6, of Renous. All were performed successfully by Drs. Moore, Nicholson and Desmond.

## German Pirates Get Schooner

Havre, Aug. 4.—Two British schooners were torpedoed in the English Channel on Wednesday night. The crews were rescued and brought here. London, Aug. 4.—A Japanese steamer, the Khoia Maru, and the British schooner G. C. Gradwell, have been sunk. The Khoia Maru was a vessel of 1,162 tons. She was last reported sailing from Barry for Bizerta, Tunis, on July 14.

## Belgians Doing Well in East Africa

Havre, Aug. 4.—Further progress for the Belgian forces invading German East Africa is announced in an official statement issued by the Belgian War Office. The text of the statement follows:

"The right wing of Belgian troops, pursuing its march southward, has occupied Kigoma, in the district of Ujiji, the most important German post on Lake Tanganyika. Kigoma is the terminus of the railroad from Dar-es-Salaam the capital of the colony, to the lake."

## Purchase Price of Danish West Indies

Washington, Aug. 4.—It was announced today by the State Department that the treaty by which the United States is to purchase the Danish West Indies from Denmark for \$25,000,000 was signed at New York this morning by Secretary Lansing and Minister Constantine Brun.

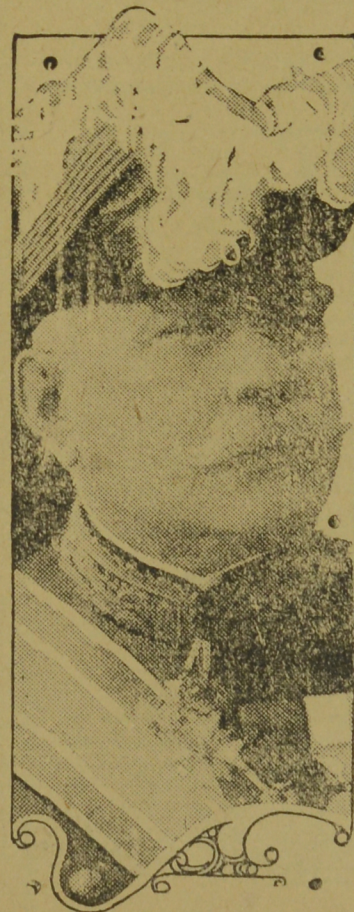
See authorities and moral reform workers all over the Maritime Provinces. During his term of office here Chief Rideout has abolished the open selling of liquor, reduced drunkenness to a minimum, and his administration has been marked by an almost entire absence of serious crime.

"He was recently elected Vice-president of the Chief Constables' Association of Canada."

"Chief Rideout, who was 45 years old on July 30th, 1916, joined the Fredericton police force as a patrolman twenty-one years ago, and has been actively engaged in police work ever since. He was in Fredericton until May, 1907, when he was engaged by the City of Moncton to organize a police force and make an attempt to cope with the open bars and other bad conditions which obtained at that time. How well he has succeeded is matter of knowledge among our citizens. His salary was at first \$900 per year, but this was subsequently increased to \$1,400, until the present year, when it was cut down, for economy, to \$1,100."

### Hardly Correct.

The statement of the Transcript that Chief Rideout had not been an applicant for the position can hardly be accepted as correct, as he had been in Fredericton more than once this summer and had conferred with members of the Police Commission. It also may be said that there have been other applicants in New Brunswick, including Chief Finley, of Newcastle, ex-Sergeant Campbell of St. John, and Policeman Lacombe, of Campbellton.
