MANY NEW CASES OF INFANTILE PARALYSIS

New York, Aug. 3.—The epidemic of infantile paralysis reached the highest mark today in the number of new cases. The health department figures showed that 217 developed during the twenty-four hours ended at 10 a. m., and that the death list for the same period was 43, two more than yesterday. Seventy six were stricken at Manhattan alone, where the epidemic now appears to be centred.

GOLF PLAYER KILLED ON THE BATTLEFIELD

San Francisco, Cal., Aug. 3.—Campbell White, one of the best known amateur golf players on the Pacific coast, was killed on the battlefield July 13, according to word cabled here. He joined the British forces in Europe two years ago.

STEAMSHIP AND VESSEL HAS BEEN SUNK

London, Aug. 3.—The Cocker line steamship Britannic, of 3,487 tons gross, has been sunk, it was announced at Lloyd's Shipping Agency today. She was unarmed.

The British sailing vessel Margaret Sutton, 197 tons, also has been sunk.

The Britannic was 342 feet long, 49 feet beam and 24 feet deep. She was built at West Hartlepool in 1904.

(Continued from page 2.) is one of those who assisted in the collection of money from the liquor interests. He is the man who telephoned to one of the breweries that unless he got \$500 before the train left, prohibition would go into effect before morning. Mr. Tennant is connected with the Nova Scotia Construction Company, the company which has the contract for the construction of the Valley Railway from Gagetown to Welsford, a contract that some day will be investigated. The vice-president and manager of this company, Mr. Lindsay, makes his headquarters in Mr. Tennant's rear office, and anyone who wants anything from Mr. Lindsay must first pass through Mr. Tennant's hands.

Mr. Nagle.

"Mr. Nagle, another director, was a Liberal as long as the Liberals had anything to give him, and then changed over. He is the secretary-treasurer of the Northern Dredging Company and a business associate of Kennedy & McDonald, sub-contractors on the Valley Railway.

"There are two other directors who have been appointed recently, and of whom I hope for better things, but these are the men who control the Standard and the Standard represents the hoodlums of the government party.

"There is another matter which I might mention. When the Drummonds constructed their railway from Bathurst to their iron mines, the province guaranteed bonds for the railway to the extent of \$297,000. This is so much money thrown away, as the mines are not in operation and the railway is closed down. The province has not yet had to pay any interest on these bonds, but I believe that it will have to pay not only the interest, but also the principle, as it will the interest and principle of the \$150,000 guaranteed bonds for Mr. Pinder's railway. To get to my point, some of the men who profited by that \$297,000 expenditure, paid \$14,000 for stock in the St. John Standard."

At the close of his address Mr. Carter was heartily and enthusiastically applauded.

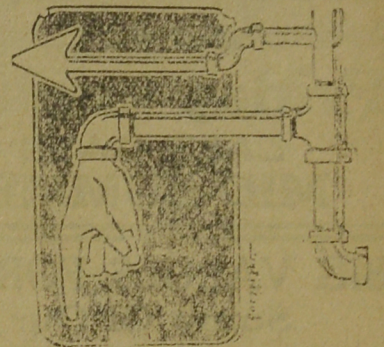

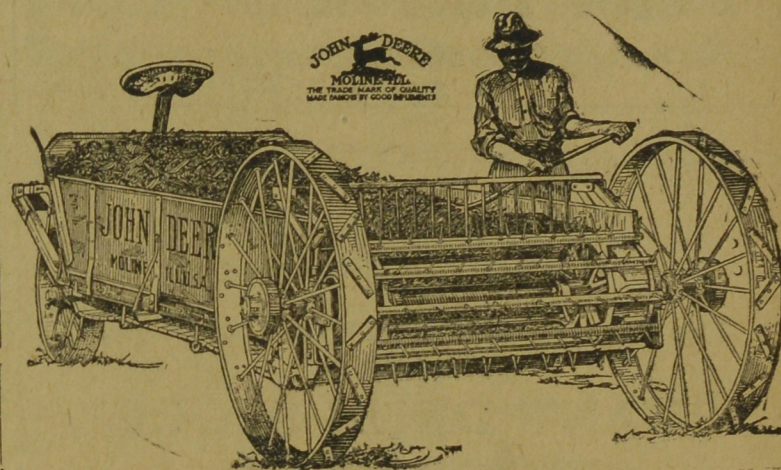
