

SIXTY RECRUITS SECURED IN TWO DAYS' CAMPAIGN

Several New Recruits for the 236th Have Reported at Headquarters.

The result of the first two days of the recruiting campaign for the 236th Overseas Battalion are about sixty recruits.

Reports received at the Kilties headquarters here up to noon today show that Northumberland and Carleton counties are tied for the leadership in providing recruits for the Kilties in this opening campaign with eleven each for the first two days.

At Centreville, Carleton county, where Lieut. Col. Guthrie spoke last night on his tour of the province, there were six volunteers, but only four of them will join the Kilties, one of the others being for No. 9 Siege Battery and the 6th man having enlisted for home service with the 62nd Regiment detention company, located at St. John.

Kings county, with three recruits, had a meeting at Norton last night, and Westmorland county, with two recruits at Sackville, got into the list today with those counties that have already provided recruits for their platoons.

If results are obtained only at the present rate, approximately one-half of the battalion will be recruited in the fifteen days' campaign now on.

The number of recruits at the opening meetings totalled 31. There have been upwards of ten others obtained by the recruiters between meetings. This morning three of those enlisted at last night's meetings reported for duty with the Kilties. One of them was Thos. Vance, who enlisted at McAdam, and the other two were Ivory Inman and Harry F. Lifford, who enlisted at Centreville.

James Horlock Riordan, of Taymouth, has enlisted here as the result of Monday night's meeting. He is to be sent to Stanley parish on a recruiting tour.


