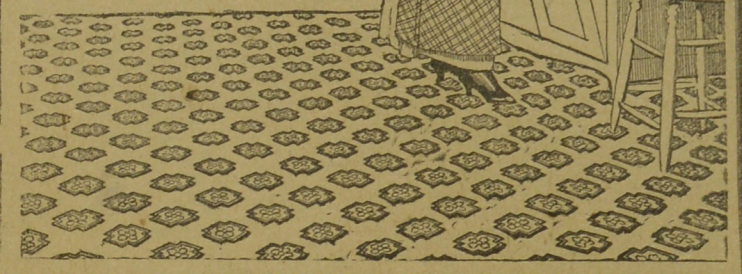

## DOUGALD S. MacCATHRINE PASSED AWAY TUESDAY

Well Known Resident of Fredericton—  
Prominent in St. Andrew's Society.

Dougald Stewart McCathrine passed away at five o'clock yesterday afternoon at his residence, Charlotte street. Death was due to heart failure, but the deceased had been ailing for some time and had returned but recently from New York, where he had consulted a specialist. The deceased was aged 73 years. He was a native of Buctouche, a son of Charles Frederick McCathrine, who was born in Scotland. He is survived by a widow, one son, Mr. Dougald McCathrine, and two daughters, Miss Ina McCathrine and Mrs. Kenneth White, all of Fredericton.

The funeral will take place at 2.30 Thursday afternoon. Rev. Mr. Marshall will conduct the service, and interment will be made at the Rural Cemetery.

The late Mr. McCathrine was a prominent member of St. Andrew's Society. He also took an active interest in politics, belonging to the Conservative party. At the time of his death he was president of the Frederick Park Association and all his lifetime was interested in horse racing. He conducted a store in this city for many years and also acted as a commercial agent, travelling through all the central and northern parts of New Brunswick.

## Marysville Man Wounded.

Frank Beasley, of Marysville, is reported wounded with an infantry unit in France. Private Beasley is a native of England, but resided in Marysville for some time.

## Death of a Child.

Jack R. Dunbar, aged 15 months, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lorne Dunbar, of St. Marys, died this morning of whooping cough. Besides the parents one sister and one brother remain. The funeral will take place at 2.30 p.m. on Thursday.
