The music was in charge of his young school mates. The hymns used were "Onward, Christian Soldiers," "Changed in the twinkling of an eye," "We'll never say good-bye in heaven" and "Meet me there." The church was decorated with flags, the Union Jack being draped over the pulpit. Flowers and greenery were also used in decoration. This also was the work of his young friends.

Sydney Dale came to this country with the Middlemore children eleven years ago, and entered the home of Mr. and Mrs. Whitehead, where he proved himself a worthy son. He engaged himself to his companions and indeed was a favorite with all he met. Much sympathy is felt for Mr. and Mrs. Whitehead and family.

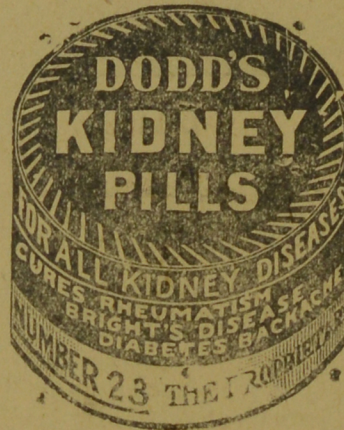

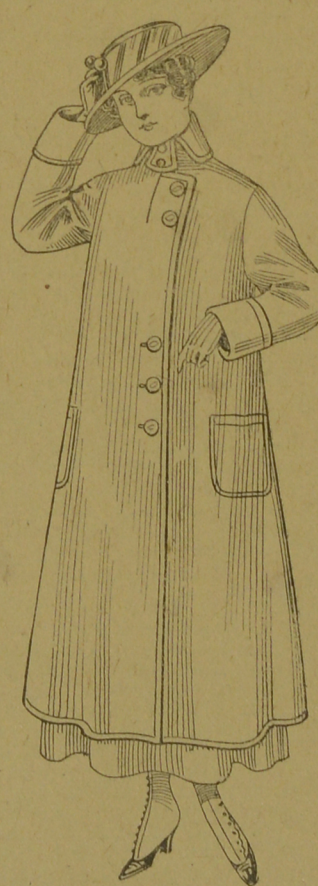
