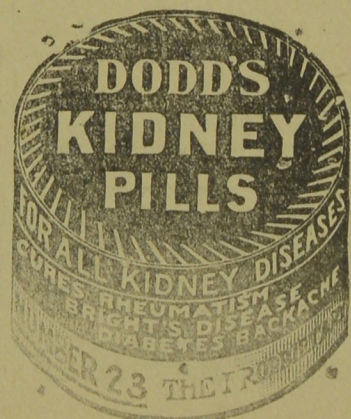

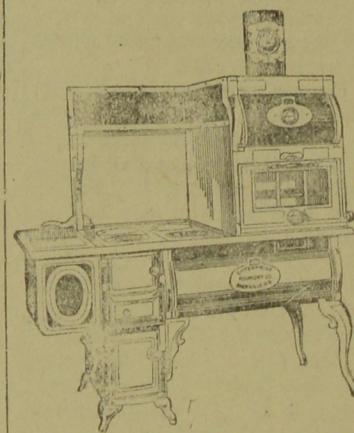
#### REDMOND SUPPORTER ELECTED.

#### HOW TO GET ROSY LIPS.

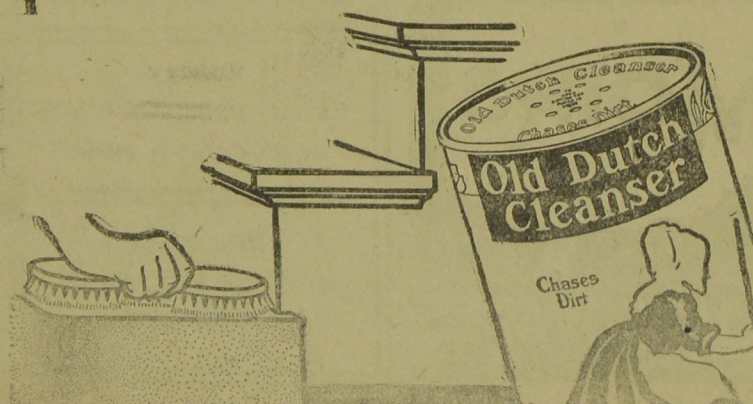

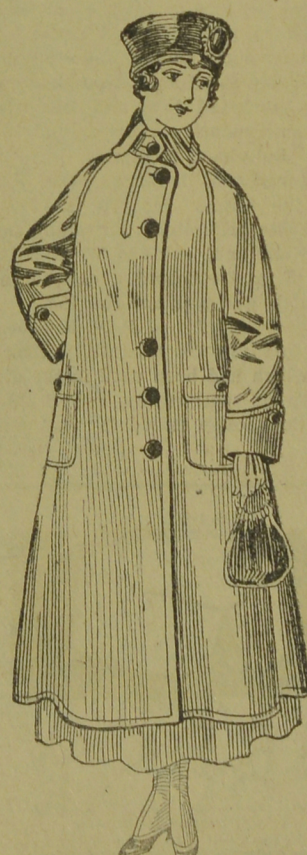
