EIGHTY-FOUR HAVE
VOLUNTEERED DURING
KILTIES' CAMPAIGN

Two Enlisted Here Yesterday Afternoon---Carload of Barrack Supplies for 236th Battalion Have Arrived.

Eighty-four men have volunteered to join the 236th Battalion since the campaign for recruits started on Monday last. Of that number twenty-one volunteered last night. Seven of those were at St. Leonards, where Colonel P. A. Guthrie, officer commanding the battalion, was the chief speaker.

It is expected that upwards of one hundred volunteers for the Kilties will be secured during the first week of the campaign.

By counties the totals of volunteers are as follows: York 10, Sunbury 1, Charlotte 3, Carleton 11, Madawaska 9, Restigouche 4, Gloucester 5, Northumberland 12, Kent 4, Westmorland 5, Kings 3, St. John 17.

Local Recruits.

Two more Fredericton boys have enlisted with the Kilties, Ray Edward Sampson and Herbert V. Allen having been enrolled and sworn in yesterday afternoon. Both gave their ages as 18 years.

Private Allen is a son of Mr. Wesley Allen, Shore street, and his brother, Jack Allen, was recently severely wounded.

Today it was said that Mr. Harry Sampson would probably join the corps of cooks now with the Kilties within a short time, as they have some good openings for experienced cooks.

DISPUTE WITH
SCHOOL BOARD MAY
BE CARRIED TO COURT

R. L. Phillips to Test Legality of School Boards Action in Removing His Daughter From Charlotte Street School.

It is reported today that Mr. R. L. Phillips is about to carry his dispute with the Fredericton School Board into the courts. What particular action is not known, as those concerned decline to discuss the matter, but it is thought probable that an application will be made before a Supreme Court judge.

Mr. Phillips' dispute with the School Board has arisen out of the Board's division of the city into districts, and its decision to allot pupils residing in those districts to certain schools, irrespective of what school they had attended before.

In Mr. Phillips' case one of his daughters had been attending Charlotte street school. When the districts were created she was assigned to the Smythe Street School. Mr. Phillips objected to the change, and applied to the School Board for permission for her to remain at the Charlotte Street School. The board considered the matter, but decided that it could not grant the request, as many similar ones would follow.

It is understood that one feature of the trouble is that no permit for Mr. Phillips' daughter to attend another school was issued when she was refused admittance to the Charlotte Street School.

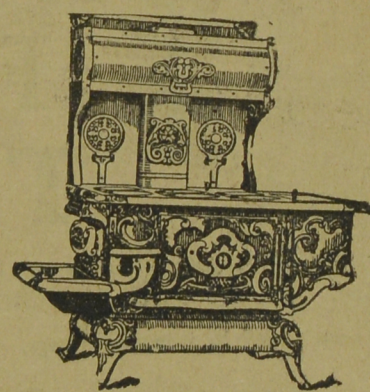
