## FREIGHT HANDLER'S STRIKE COLLAPSES

Toronto, Nov. 22.—The Canadian Pacific freight handlers' strike in Toronto has collapsed, the men returning to work without any terms from the company. Their demands for an increased rate of wages was the subject of a meeting today between His Worship the Mayor, who acted as mediator between the company and the men, and Mr. Allan Purvis, general superintendent of the C. P. R. The company voluntarily granted an increase to hourly men of 2c. per hour.

The strike collapsed owing to the ability of the company to handle all freight offering, and the sympathy of the general public being with them on account of the very fair manner in which they offered to arbitrate the dispute either under the Lemieux Act, or local friendly arbitration by business men of Toronto, both of which were refused by the men.

The men have to thank His Worship Mayor Church, who interceded with the company on their behalf, in bringing about a settlement of the unfortunate strike.

## Hotel Keeper Had To Apologize

Windsor, Ont., Nov. 23.—Following a demonstration made by soldiers of the 241st Battalion on Monday night against the British American Hotel and its proprietor, E. E. Ingrah, because of an insult said to have been offered two of the khaki clad men, a written retraction and apology to the soldiers for his remarks has been made by Mr. Ingram.

### Important Transfer.

The property of the Partington Pulp & Paper Co., Ltd., has been formally transferred to the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Co., Ltd. A mortgage of \$1,500,000 has been put on the property by the Eastern Trust Co. to secure an issue of bonds.

### STANLEY MAN DIES OF WOUNDS.

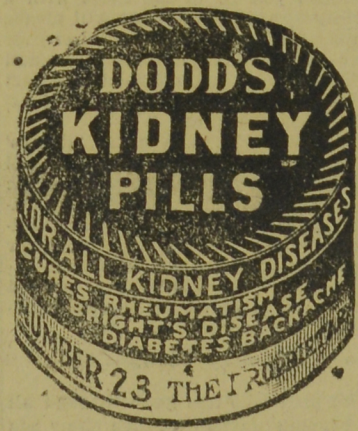

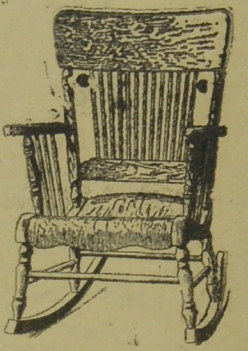
