The schooner Fannie N. Fay, which is en route to Fredericton from New York with a cargo of coal, has been chartered to load lumber from Gagetown, N.B., to the Sound or New York for \$5.25 for the former and \$5.50 for the latter.

## URBAN STOCK CO.

The Urban Stock Company arrived from Woodstock today at noon, coming over the St. John & Quebec Railway. The company will present the drama, The Divorce Question, at the Opera House tonight. A large audience saw the company at Woodstock last night.

## DIED AT REVERE, MASS.

News was received here yesterday of the death at Revere, Mass., of Mr. E. Austin Harris, a former resident of York. He is survived by a widow and several children. Mr. Harris some years ago conducted a hotel at Marysville and later he was the proprietor of the Springhill Hotel.

## AGAIN HARBOR MASTER.

The Wharf Committee, Ald. Barker chairman, has sold the city wharfage and anchorage to Mr. Harry C. Mackey for \$250. Mr. Mackey is now harbor master. The upset price of \$400 was placed on the wharfage and anchorage when they were offered at auction but there were no bids.

## AGAINST DAYLIGHT SAVING.

A Halifax despatch says:—"The labor men of Halifax are strongly opposed to the daylight saving time. Today a largely signed petition was presented to the Board of Control against the scheme and the president of the Longshoremen's Union, representing 1,200 men, also appeared before the board and asked that steps be taken to have the old time restored."

## DIED YESTERDAY.

Mr. Seymour King passed away yesterday afternoon at his home in Charlotte street, after a short illness. He is survived by two sons, Frank and Walter, and four daughters, Mrs. Thomas Haines and Miss Mary V., at home; Mrs. B. O'Malley of Springfield, Mass., and Mrs. Harry Preston of Boston, Mass. The funeral will take place Wednesday afternoon, leaving the house at 2.15. Service will be conducted at St. Dunstan's church by Rev. Father Carney at 2.30. Interment will be made at the Hermitage.

## COL. MACLAREN'S APPOINTMENT.

Regarding Lieut. Col. Murray MacLaren's new appointment, a recent despatch from London says:—"Lieut. Col. Murray MacLaren has arrived in London to become deputy director of medical services at London and second in command to General Jones in the place of Colonel Drum. The latter's new appointment has not yet been determined. Colonel Wyld of Toronto, will succeed Lieut. Col. MacLaren, thus returning to the hospital where he was formerly registered. Colonel Shillington, A.F.M.S., at Bramshott Camp, will probably take Colonel Wyld's place in London."

## THE FOX INDUSTRY.

Mr. Isaac Burden, a former Frederictonian, who was for some years employed as accountant with the Willard Kitchen Company, is here from Prince Edward Island, on a visit to his old home. Mr. Burden says that the black fox industry is steadily recovering its status. A year ago stock which could be bought for twenty-five cents on the dollar is today selling at par. Recently a number of pelts from the Island were sold in New York at an average price of \$765 each. Mr. Burden says the industry is getting down to a fair basis and it is certain to yield a good return to the investors.

### SPRINKLER SYSTEM TO BE INSTALLED AT VICTORIA MILL

Local Plant of Fraser Limited Will Have Best Fire-Fighting Equipment in Province--Will Conform to City System.

Fraser Limited, New Brunswick's greatest lumbering firm, is to install a modern sprinkler system in the Victoria Mill, the firm's plant in this city. (Mr. George McKnight, city engineer, this morning visited the Victoria Mill and laid out the ground so as to permit the sprinkler system being connected with the city's water system whenever the latter may be extended as far as the Victoria Mill.

## To Use Own Pumps.

At first the system will be supplied with water from pumps inside the mill, which will draw from the river. Later it is possible that a reservoir will be constructed upon the hill and gravity used to operate the system.

In addition to a sprinkler system inside the mill, three hydrants are also to be installed in various parts of the mill yard. These will be six inch hydrants and will be supplied by eight-inch mains. They will conform with the fire fighting system of the city. Later it is intended to extend the sprinkler system to all parts of the mill yard.

This new equipment will give the Victoria Mill the best fire fighting equipment connected with any lumber plant in New Brunswick and will prevent the disaster which wiped out the Aberdeen Mill, operated in the West End by the Frasers about twelve years ago.

### ELWOOD BURTT'S DRIVE ON KESWICK GOT OUT SAFELY

Arrived at Mill Today--Good Run of Bank Logs at Springhill--Cheering Word of Drives of Upper St. John

Mr. Elwood Burtt's drive on the Keswick was brought out safely to his mill at Burtt's Corner this morning. The drive contained four and a half million feet and will be manufactured at Burtt's Corner. This season Mr. Burtt was the only operator driving on the Keswick. There was no rain and very little snow and the driving was hard on the brooks but in the main stream the dams proved of great help.

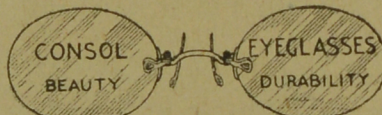
## Bank Logs Coming In.

Noble of this city, who operates himself on the Upper St. John and also handles the Upper Corporation drive, wrote about a week ago that he expected that he and his crew would be home on either Wednesday or Friday of this week. Driving conditions at the time of writing were excellent, with a prospect of all lumber coming out.

Word of Mr. John Kilburn's drive is also very encouraging and it is expected that all his lumber will come out.

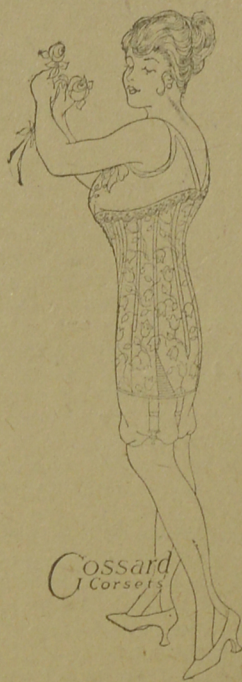

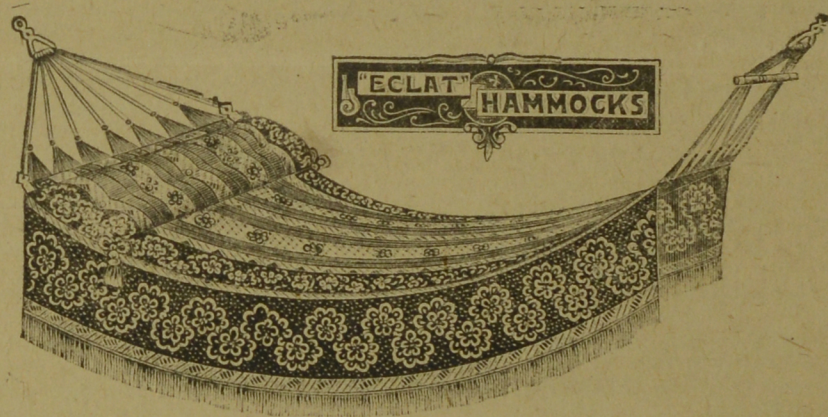
