HON. A. E. KEMP THE NEW MINISTER OF MILITIA

Ottawa, Nov. 23.—Hon. A. E. Kemp, M. P. for East Toronto, Minister without portfolio in the Borden cabinet and chairman since May, 1915, of the war purchasing commission, has been sworn in as Minister of Militia in succession to Major General Sam Hughes. The new Minister was sworn in by His Excellency, the Governor General at Rideau Hall this afternoon.

Mr. Speaker Seavigny will be in Ottawa tomorrow and will issue writs for the by-election necessitated through Mr. Kemp being elevated to a position of emolument under the crown. The writs will be issued immediately and will call for the election some time between Dec. 15 and 20. Whether there will be a contest or not is, of course, not known here.

The new Minister of Militia is the exact antithesis of the former minister. General Hughes followed the war game all his life; Mr. Kemp's walks in life have been in the paths of peace and commerce. General Hughes took to militia work at the age of 14; Mr. Kemp has been in business all his life.

In fact, the day of the war lord in Canada has passed for the time being,

at least, with the accession of Mr. Kemp to the position of Minister of Militia. In the matter of age, Mr. Kemp has the advantage of five years over his predecessor. General Hughes is 63; Mr. Kemp 58. Both are wealthy men; both belong to the Orange order.

Hon. A. E. Kemp was born in 1858, and is a manufacturer of metal work and tinware. He was president of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association in 1895 and 1896; he was also elected president of Toronto Board of Trade in 1899 and 1900, and was a delegate of the board to the British association meetings at Bristol in 1898 and to the fourth congress of the Chambers of Commerce of the Empire, at London in 1900. He was elected to the House of Commons in 1900 and re-elected in 1904. He was defeated by Joseph Russell in 1908, but was again re-elected in 1911, becoming a minister without portfolio in the Borden cabinet in October of that year. He was appointed chairman of the war purchasing commission on May 8, 1915, a position he has held up to the present time. He has several times acted as Minister of Militia in General Hughes' absence.
