THE RUSSIAN WAR OFFICE STATEMENT TELLS OF SHARP FIGHTING IN THE EAST

PETROGRAD, Jan 3 (via London).—A statement given out by the Russian War Office tonight says: "In the Caucasus, on the Black Sea coast, during the night of the first of January, the Turks attempted to approach our positions, but were stopped by our fire. "In the direction of Hamadan, Persia, southwest of the town of Azadabad, we attacked a body of 500 Persian gendarmes and drove them back towards the village of Chena, north of Kangawar, killing dozens of rebels and capturng prisoners and supplies. We suffered no losses.


