HAS THREE BROTHERS SERVING AT THE FRONT

Brother of Lt. Col. McKenzie of the 26th Battalion a Student at The U. N. B.

Colin McKenzie, of Campbellton, a member of this year's freshmen class at the U. N. B., has three brothers serving at the front, two of whom are graduates and the other a former student at the institution on the hill.

His eldest brother, Lieut. Col. A. E. G. McKenzie, who graduated from the U. N. B. in 1914, is the commanding officer of the 26th New Brunswick Battalion, now on the firing line. Another brother, Lionel McKenzie, graduated in 1900 with the degree of B. Sc., and was practising his profession in the west when the war broke out. He promptly joined an engineering corps and is now at the front. Another brother, Pearl, who was a student at the U. N. B. a few years ago, went to the front with a battalion organized in Winnipeg. A fourth brother has a physical defect which has debarred him from joining the service, and Colin's reason for not being in khaki is his youth. The McKenzie boys, when at college, were leaders in athletics, and their names always figured in the prize list at the annual sports.

It is scarcely necessary to add that these patriotic young men are all staunch Liberals in politics, and one of them, Lieut. Colonel McKenzie, was an Opposition candidate in Restigouche at the last provincial election.

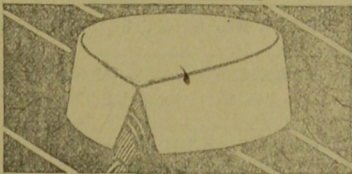

236th Will Start New Campaign Next Week

Officers Will be Sent to Their Respective Counties--Sewerage System For Old Govt. House

The recruiting campaign on behalf of the 236th Highlanders is to be resumed next week. At a meeting of officers held yesterday, at which Lt. Col. Guthrie presided, it was decided that all officers with the exception of the company commanders and those of the battalion staff, should go to their respective counties and canvass for recruits. Parties of N. C. O.'s and men will accompany each officer.

After the campaign of next week a more intense campaign will begin and will be followed by personal correspondence.

In the meantime, working parties under the command of the quartermaster, Hon. Capt. J. D. Black, will install a sewerage system for the Old Government House, and do other necessary work about quarters.

Traffic Regulations To Be Considered Tuesday

Ald. McLellan Invites Suggestions From Citizens--Purchase of Fire Apparatus.

Ald. R. W. McLellan has requested all persons interested in the traffic regulations which it is proposed to enact for the city of Fredericton to attend the special meeting of the City Council which is to be held on Tuesday night next. Ald. McLellan, as chairman of the Roads and Streets Committee, presented a draft of the proposed by-law to the City Council some time ago. This is subject to amendment, and suggestions of citizens will be welcomed.

The City Council, at the same meeting, will consider the purchase of fire apparatus which was authorized at a recent committee meeting. Opposition to the expenditure of nearly \$9,000 on apparatus, which has developed among some heavy taxpayers, is expected to take form.

KAISER'S ENGINEER KILLED BY BOMB

Paris, Oct. 28.—A bomb dropped by an aviator of the Entente Allies has killed the engineer driving the train of the Emperor William of Germany, according to information received at Zurich, Switzerland.

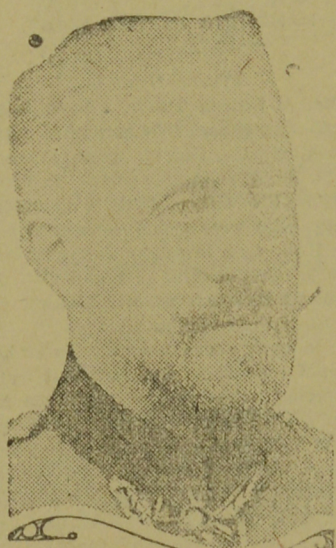
Emperor William recently was reported to be at Bapaume, on Somme front, personally overseeing the preliminaries for a counter offensive.
