CARLETON POTATO SHIPPERS ORGANIZE AN EXCHANGE

Woodstock, Aug. 21.—For years past potato shippers of this province have been of the opinion that an improvement in conditions was needed. Now and again these opinions have been ventilated, but until the present week no material improvement has been effected.

Most of the large shippers have now united in forming a marketing organization which bids fair to be of lasting benefit not only to the shippers immediately concerned, but also to those not interested in the new organization, and also the buyers at western points.

The new organization is to be known as New Brunswick Potato Exchange, Limited, and a charter is now being applied for, having for its object not only the marketing of potatoes, but also to promote legislation to stimulate agricultural production in the province, and to take such action as shall be necessary to secure satisfactory freight rates, better lined car service and other needed improvements for the betterment of the potato industry.

Already a case has been prepared by the solicitor of the company, W. P. Jones, for presentation to the board of railway commissioners; complaining of a newly published freight tariff which becomes operative on the 1st of September next, and which advances the freight rate on potatoes from points in New Brunswick to points in Ontario and Quebec from 3 cents to 6 cents per 100 lbs.

Considering that organization arrangements were only completed on Monday last, the company is to be complimented on its energy and promptitude in objecting to this attempted advance.

A deputation has been appointed to wait on the officials of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Montreal to ask for better lined car equipment.

A. Mallinson is looking after the details of organization and has used the following arguments in favor of consolidation:

Instead of each shipper having his own broker, both in Montreal and in Toronto, the company will have one expert salesman at each of these points who will devote his whole time to the interests of the company.

Instead of having one caretaker go through with every one or two cars, the new company will be able to bunch shipments so that one caretaker can do as much work as five or six did previously.

Instead of each shipper wiring his broker several times daily, one telegram will now do the work of a dozen under the old conditions.

Instead of cars of potatoes being consigned to western markets unsold, all cars will from now on be sold before leaving shipping point.

During the past few years it has been the growing custom among shippers to consign cars unsold to various markets, and it has often happened that through the different shippers acting without any knowledge of what their competitors were doing, as many as forty cars of potatoes would arrive at either Montreal or Toronto almost every night when the market was not requiring more than half of them.

This indiscriminate distribution has resulted in losses to the potato industry of many thousands of dollars annually. The new company expects to begin operations early in September.

DESCRIPTION OF BRITISH ATTACK

Germans Surrendered Without Waiting

To be Bombed by the British Raiders

One after another, as though coming to the top of stairs, heads and shoulders appear out of the trench. Each German had his hands up and in file the prisoners moved past a Briton on the parapet. These Germans, who had not waited to be bombed out, but had surrendered, came legging it at top speed back toward the British first line trenches.

Now British helmets rise from the German first line and start on another charge to the German support trench. They will clean up any Germans lying in shell craters on the way. They grow dim in the distance and in the fading light, but they get there.

Bit by bit gains are made between big attacks. The British now are within one thousand yards of Thiepval, maintain their position in Guillemont and are within three hundred yards of Ginchy and of Martinpuich.

236TH RECRUITING CAMPAIGN COMING SOON

Fire to be Lighted at Currie's Mountain—Two Recruits Enlisted This Morning.

The recruiting campaign for the 236th Highlanders is expected to begin in a short time, possibly next week. Arrangements have been made to have a signal fire lighted upon Currie's Mountain, a prominent hill in Douglas about six miles above Fredericton, on the day the recruiting campaign will open.

Similar fires to be lighted upon other high hills in the province.
