QUEEN'S TEMPERANCE WORKERS IN SESSION

Chipman, N. B., Aug. 21.—A very successful convention of the temperance workers of eastern Queens county and the parish of Northfield, Sunbury county, was held this afternoon in King's hall, and was attended by delegates representing churches and other organizations.

Mr. Isaac Baird was elected chairman and Harry King secretary. Rev. W. D. Wilson, field secretary of the Dominion Alliance, explained the new provincial prohibition law thoroughly and after considerable discussion it was unanimously resolved that in the opinion of this convention the new law is far superior to the Scott Act and that steps be taken to have the latter act repealed, so that the provincial law may come into force.

An auxiliary of the Dominion Alliance was then organized, the following officers being elected: President, W. B. Evans, Rothwell; vice-president, Daniel Wilson, Cambridge; sec.-treas., Harry King, Chipman; additional members of the executive, J. M. Kennedy, Minto, and J. A. Corey, Canaan.

In the evening a public meeting was held and addresses were given by Rev. E. E. Mowatt, Rev. A. A. Hovey, Rev. W. D. Wilson, Rev. D. Price, W. B. Evans acted as chairman. A resolution in favor of the repeal of the Scott Act was unanimously passed. The united choirs of the Presbyterian and Baptist churches furnished appropriate music.

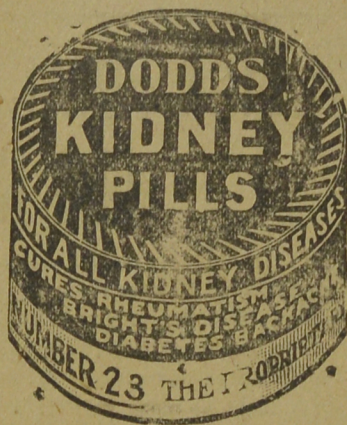

Public Schools Notice.

FOR the special benefit of pupils who are unable to complete the common school course, the Trustees will open a pre-vocational department in the York Street School building. Applicants for admission to this department will file their names with the Secretary and obtain an admission certificate.

In accordance with the Compulsory Schools Act, all children from six to fourteen years of age must be in attendance at school. In every case the reason for non-attendance must be given to the Board of School Trustees by the parent or guardian of the child.

In pursuance of Sec. 73 of the Schools Act, the Secretary is required in every case to demand a physician's certificate or other evidence of recent successful vaccination before a permit may be issued.

All the schools will be re-opened on Monday, 28th inst., at 9 o'clock, a.m., and permits may be obtained at the office on York street during the previous week. Applicants for admission to the Model School, whose names have been registered, will apply for permits on Friday, 25th inst.

POLICE FORCE ON STRIKE.

Cops of Sherbrooke, Quebec, Want More Pay.

Sherbrooke, Aug. 22.—The Sherbrooke police force, turned down when it demanded an increase in pay from the City Council, has decided to go on strike. The bluecoats receive now \$13 for a week of seven days, with no time off. The time of strike has been chosen to coincide with the opening of the Sherbrooke Fair, when several thousand extra people are in the city, including many crooks.

The city council, in a militant mood, threatens to raise an amateur police force from among the citizens.

RAILWAY PRESIDENTS OBJECT.

They are Opposed to President Wilson's Plan.

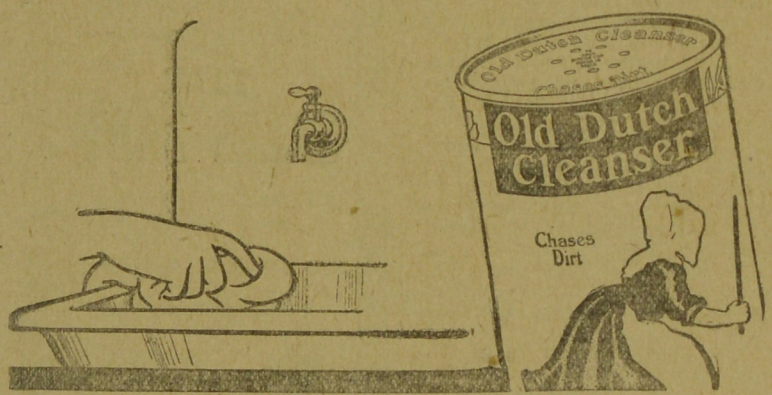
