236TH BATTALION HAS MORE THAN 300 MEN

Muster Parade Shows York County Platoon is the Strongest.

The strength of the 236th Highlanders was 230, with 74 in the attached company, according to the result of the muster parade held recently.

There have been many rejections, however. Flat feet are the chief cause. Men who have worn moccasins and jarrigans for long periods are found to suffer from this defect.

The following tabulation by platoons and companies has been completed, showing present actual strength of the regiment, as disclosed in the muster parade:

"A" company leads with 73 men, and in York county has the strongest platoon also, with 45 recruits.

"D" company is next with a present strength of 64, with St. John city platoon numbering 44.

Northumberland county is third in strength, leading "C" company with a membership of 29.

Headquarters staff numbers 11.

"A" company—No. 1 platoon, York county, 45 men; No. 2 platoon, Sunbury county, 7; No. 3 platoon, Queens county, 5; No. 4 platoon, Charlotte county, 16. Total, 73.

"B" company—No. 5 platoon, Carleton county, 18 men; No. 6 platoon, Victoria county, nil; No. 7 platoon, Madawaska county, 7; No. 8 platoon, Restigouche county, 12. Total, 37.

"C" company—No. 9 platoon, Gloucester county, 8; No. 10 platoon, Westmorland county, 5; No. 11 platoon, Kent county, 3; No. 12 platoon, Northumberland county, 29. Total, 45.

"D" company—No. 13 platoon, Albert county, 4; No. 14 platoon, Kings county, 15; No. 15 platoon, St. John county, 1; No. 16 platoon, St. John City, 44. Total, 64.

GUERNSEY COW BROUGHT BIG PRICE

North Easton, Mass., Oct. 24.—The largest auction of Guernsey cattle ever held in this country took place today at the estate of F. Lothrop Ames.

A new record price for a Guernsey cow was established when Langwater Dairymaid, an 8-year-old bred by Mr. Ames, was sold for \$6,150. This was \$1,140 more than was paid for Mary Rima in 1914 at Berwin, Pa. The next largest price paid was \$5,000 by John S. Ames for Langwater Generous.

Among other high sales were \$4,200 each for two cows, and a total of \$15,200 for five cows and a heifer; \$1,000 for a bull calf, and \$3,000 for a bull.

FREDERICTON AND ST. MARYS MEN IN CASUALTY LIST

Private Gordon Gray Wounded --Private Jack Howell Shot in Knee.

Private Gordon Gray, of this city, is reported wounded in France. Private Gray, early in the war, went to Halifax as a member of the company furnished to the Composite Battalion by the 71st York Regiment.

At the time of the formation of the 55th Battalion he volunteered with a number of other men from the Composite Battalion and went overseas with it. Later he was drafted to a battalion in France.

Private John Howell, of St. Marys, is reported wounded in the knee. He enlisted with the 6th Mounted Rifles and on that unit being broken up went in the 4th Mounted Rifles. He was an electrician prior to enlistment and was well known here and in St. John.

POPE TO CREATE NEW CARDINALS

Rome, via Paris, Oct. 24.—Pope Benedict has decided to hold a secret consistory December 4, and a public consistory December 7, at which he will create new Cardinals. The red hat will be conferred on Monsignor Count Raffaele Scapinelli, former Papal Nuncio at Vienna, and Monsignor Fruhjirth, former Nuncio at Munich.

At the consistory Pope Benedict will deliver an allocution in which he will discuss the European situation and pray for a cessation of the war.

was sent to the Rio Grande. When the great war in Europe began he determined to fight for his own country. He deserted and went into Mexico, where Carranza's troops arrested him as a spy. He was sentenced to be shot and escaped only by appealing to a British consul. The Mexican authorities then handed him over to the United States and he was imprisoned as a deserter. Another attempt to desert gave him a still heavier sentence. He finally got his discharge and worked his way up the Pacific coast to Victoria, B. C.

Raid and Arrest.

The police this morning raided the Waverly Hotel under a Canada Temperance Act warrant. Policemen Sturgeon, Hughes, Jones and Murray took part in it, and a small quantity of liquor was seized. The proprietor of the hotel was arrested on the charge of interfering with the police during the raid. He was taken to the police station by Policeman Murray and later was liberated on \$1,500 bail. The interference is understood to consist of the breaking of bottle of liquor after they had been seized.

Potatoes Go Up.

Potatoes, following the example of flour and sugar, have advanced in price. This morning they sold in the market at \$3 a barrel and shippers are now said to be paying that price.

Government Meeting.

Lieut. Governor Wood and the members of the Provincial Government are in the city today. Incidentally, Organizer Harry Woods and Mr. John Young, M. P. P., are also here. The Government is holding a meeting today.
