A SERIOUS FIRE IN BATHURST, R. C. CHURCH

Blaze Broke Out While Mass Was in Progress on Sunday--A Woman Slightly Injured.

Bathurst, N. B., Nov. 19.—Because of the coolness and quick thinking on the part of the pastor, Rev. Father Wheten, and members of his parish, the entire congregation of the Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Church escaped in safety when a fire started during High Mass this forenoon. No person was injured except one woman who was slightly hurt. The beautiful granite edifice, one of the most splendid in New Brunswick, was damaged by fire, smoke and water to the amount of \$10,000. The property is insured through St John agencies, one of which is that of R. W. W. Frink.

Many Women Present.

The mass began at ten o'clock and was largely attended, many women and children being present. The service had been in progress about half an hour when dense smoke suddenly burst from the basement and permeated the edifice, and alarmed the large congregation.

Rev. Fr. Wheten and others calmed the frightened ones and a serious panic was averted, all escaping without injury except one.

The church bell was rung, and within five minutes the fire department had several streams on the fire, which originated near the furnace in the basement.

Fr. Wheten and willing hands carried out the Blessed Sacrament, the sacred vessels, altar furniture, images and other articles.

Ate Way Through Roof.

The fire made its way through the partition to the roof. A dense smoke filled the vestry and made a difficult task for the firemen to reach the blaze. Holes were cut in the roof and the entire vestry and the little chapel of St. Thomas were flooded with water.

The main body of the church was not damaged by fire, although there was considerable loss due to smoke and water.

Over the sanctuary the flames made a hole in the arched ceiling and it was necessary to flood this section with water which seriously damaged the high altar and destroyed the beautiful paintings and ornaments on the ceiling.

Rev. Father Wheten and the parishioners consider that the parish escaped most fortunately considering the threatening aspect of the blaze. It will be several days before services will be held in the church.

RECEIVED LETTER FROM GUNNER KITCHEN

Kingsclear Boy, Who Has Made the Supreme Sacrifice, Was Pleased With Gift of Socks.

Miss Eliza Campbell, president of the Women's Institute of Lower Kingsclear, is in receipt of a letter from Gunner Stewart Kitchen, who was last week reported killed in action. It was written on October 12th and acknowledges receipt of a gift of socks sent by the Women's Institute. Gunner Kitchen in his letter says:

"Things have taken on a serious turn here now, and it looks as if we would settle down to a winter campaign. How I dread the winter in Flanders is beyond comprehension. The wet and cold is almost unendurable, and it surprises me how I have been on the firing line for seventeen months and have not during all that time had a sick day or a trip down the line.

"If it were not for you Fredericton ladies I do not know what we would do, as you send us lots of comforts which are surely needed. Happy will I be when I once more set foot on Canadian soil."

Gunner Kitchen is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Kitchen, of Kingsclear. He was attending the U. N. B. when the war broke out and enlisted in the 23rd Field Battery.

NEW SNOW-PLOUGH

have marked advantages over the plow used in Fredericton heretofore.

The "scarifier" is operated by one horse and is used to remove the hard snow from sidewalks and to make their surfaces less slippery. Twenty-five plane-irons arranged on a crossbar and regulated by double handles perform the work. This piece of apparatus has been very effective in Ottawa, where it has greatly lessened the use of sand on icy streets. The cost is \$30.

Sidewalks and Pavements.

At Ottawa the city engineer went thoroughly into the question of pavements and sidewalks with Assistant City Engineer Asquith of Ottawa. He learned that tarvia, except for parkways and suburban roads, was condemned on account of its tendency to form "waves" in warm weather, and Hassam was condemned for its tendency to wear away, leaving rock fragments projecting.

City Engineer McKnight consulted with the Ottawa Construction Company, which is controlled by Foley & Gleason. Mr. Foley, who has been engaged in the construction of permanent pavement since he was a young man in Scotland, said that the pavement which gave the best satisfaction in Canadian climatic conditions was an eightinch concrete base covered by a tarvia cushion and surfaced with two and a half inches of sheet asphalt. This can be laid for \$2.15 per square yard. Hassam pavement in Fredericton cost \$2.35 per square yard. City Engineer McKnight saw a street of this construction on which only \$140 had been spent in twenty-two years for repairs. It is probable that this will be recommended for permanent pavement in this city.

City Engineer McKnight also saw in Ottawa granolithic sidewalks similar to those laid in Fredericton in recent years. One piece of sidewalk which had been down for twenty-five years showed no signs of wear, but the blocks had been heaved slightly out of position by frost and other forces.

In Ottawa curb and sidewalk are in one piece except for a narrow strip next a property front. The pavement is in blocks about nine feet square. A feature of the paving regulations there is that property owners may pay two-thirds of the cost of paving both sidewalk and walkway.

Snow plowing contractors there are given not more than five miles of streets to a district, and must finish each district in three hours.

The city of Ottawa also has made progress in removing telegraph and telephone and lighting poles from the streets, and placing wires in underground conduits.

Can Manufacture Alum.

At Montreal the City Engineer discovered that alum for the filtration of water could be made by a simple process, which would save \$8 per ton on cost. This was by treating clay with sulphuric acid. He saw this done at the plant of the Montreal Water and Power Co., which furnishes water for East Montreal. He brought a sample of the resulting product home with him. Experiments on the same line may be made here.
