Grape Sherbet.

Grape sherbet is especially appetizing served in frosted glass cups. To make it, use three pounds of Concord grapes, three lemons, three pints water, and three cups sugar. The grapes should be put in a granite saucepan after they are washed, mashed and freed from all juice. The juice should be measured and mixed with an equal quantity of water, the juice of the lemons and the sugar. Then the mixture should be frozen and when it is half done the whites of two eggs, beaten stiff should be mixed in.

Cereal Meat Cakes.

Make a corn meal mush in the usual way, using about one quart water well salted (one teaspoon); stir in one cup yellow corn meal and cook in double boiler about

one hour. When done stir in one to one and a half cups of chopped cold meat (any kind) and season slightly with sage. Pour into pans and when cold slice and fry in bacon drippings or butter.

Chocolate Cake.

Two cups powdered sugar, half cup butter, three eggs, half cup of milk, three cups flour, three teaspoons baking powder and two squares chocolate. Cream the butter, sugar and yolks of eggs beaten stiff then flour, beat hard, add the chocolate, previously dissolved in half a cup of water or milk. Use white icing of sugar and water.

Pear Preserves.

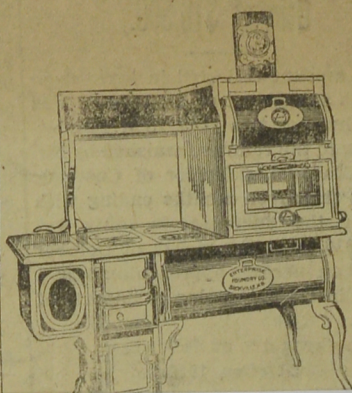
One-half bushel of pears, not too ripe, and one peck of tart apples. Peel, core and cut into quarters. Boil apples as you would for

sauce. Drain off the juice through a colander and stir the pulp. Add one quart of water and five pounds of granulated sugar and boil to a thick sirup.

Cut the pears into pieces the size of dice and boil in the sirup until tender, adding two sliced lemons and two sliced oranges. Last of all, add two pounds of seeded raisins and two pounds of dates, which have been pitted. These should not be boiled long. Cook fruit until thick. Put in glass jars boiling hot and seal.

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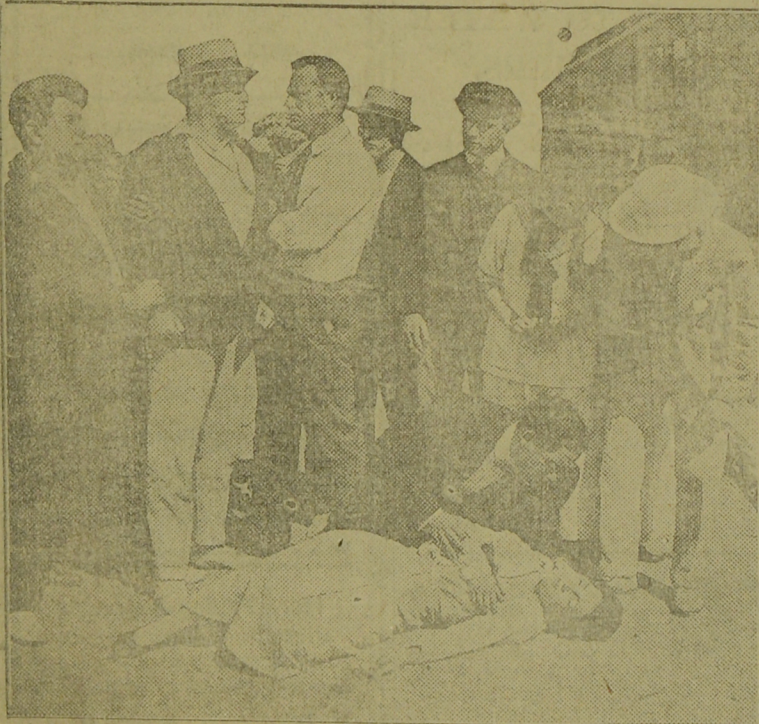

Seagruue Again Attempted to Interfere.

Sister of Shackleton, the Explorer is Freed from Marriage Bonds by a Canadian Court.

Montreal, Oct. 31.—An interesting marriage case has just been settled in the Superior Court here by Mr. Justice Allard as a result of which Kathleen Shackleton, a sister of Sir Ernest Shackleton, the Arctic explorer, is freed from her marriage to Wilbert E. Edmonson.

The suit was started several weeks ago, and in the meantime, pending judgment, Miss Shackleton, the court decrees, shall retain her maiden name. She is visiting relatives in England.

According to the evidence, the plaintiff was married in Montreal to the defendant on March 31 last, the defendant being described in the marriage certificate as a bachelor. Subsequently the plaintiff learned that the defendant had been married in Winnipeg in 1908 and that his first wife had obtained a divorce against him in one of the western states, which divorce, it was established, was not recognized by the law of Canada.

Judge Allard based his judgment on article 118 of the civil code, which provides that a second marriage cannot be contracted before the dissolution of the first.
