Continuing, the report says: "Throughout the day of April 8th an intermittent bombardment of our trenches was maintained by the enemy and artillery retaliated heavily on the German craters and trenches.

On the night of April 8-9 good progress was made in consolidating and improving our lines and communications. Some ground was gained and a few prisoners taken. On the night of April 10-11 the enemy attacked four of the craters held by our troops and some of the front line trenches. They were everywhere repulsed.

"In the fighting for the craters many deeds of high courage and devotion were performed by our men. Some of them will never be fully recorded, for few are left to tell the tale. Others in due course may be garnered when the passage of time has thrown them in relief in the recollections of those who wit- from Ottawa and will remain until af-Inessed them.


