"THE WHITE FEATHER" AT THE OPERA HOUSE

Powerful War Time Drama Made Decided Hit With Large Audience.

A good sized audience at the Opera House last night witnessed one of the best dramatic performances staged in Fredericton for a long time. The play, "The White Feather" dealt with one of the most important aspects of the great war, the German spy system, and pictured its possibilities in a manner most thrilling. The scene of operations was an English seaside hotel, where the spies had a very ingenious wireless apparatus and system of communication with the enemy.

The members of the cast all seemed to carry out their parts to perfection. Mr. Albert Brown, as Christopher Brent, apparently a brainless dandy but in reality a clever British secret service man, kept the audience amused and thrilled by turns. This was one play where the love story took only a secondary part and Olive Temple as Miriam Lee, also in the secret service, had a more prominent place in the play than Geraldine Beckwith, as Molly Preston, the fiancée of Brent.

However, all the acting was so apparently natural that one felt carried away to the very scene of the incidents portrayed.

This splendid performance will be repeated this evening and should have a liberal patronage. To accommodate the people of Marysville and vicinity, the suburban train will be held until the close of the show.

HEROIC WORK OF CANADIANS

Continuing, the report says: "Throughout the day of April 8th an intermittent bombardment of our trenches was maintained by the enemy and artillery retaliated heavily on the German craters and trenches."

"On the night of April 8-9 good progress was made in consolidating and improving our lines and communications. Some ground was gained and a few prisoners taken. On the night of April 10-11 the enemy attacked four of the craters held by our troops and some of the front line trenches. They were everywhere repulsed."

"In the fighting for the craters many deeds of high courage and devotion were performed by our men. Some of them will never be fully recorded, for few are left to tell the tale. Others in due course may be garnered when the passage of time has thrown them in relief in the recollections of those who witnessed them."

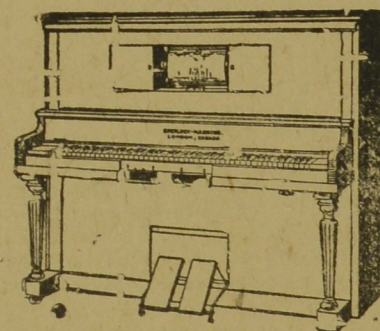
