

STUDENTS CHARGED WITH DAMAGING PROPERTY

Montreal, Oct. 5.—Events marched swiftly this morning in the aftermath of yesterday's battles between the police and Laval students on Phillips Square and at St. James Cathedral.

Here are today's developments:

Chief Campeau announced that there was no police molestation of the students until they began to damage property and make themselves a menace to the public peace.

Deputy Chief Grandchamps declared the police did their duty and he will stand by his men until they are proved to be in the wrong.

The four students arrested in yesterday's riot were arraigned in the Recorder's court on charges of damaging property, disturbing the peace and insulting the police. They pleaded not guilty and were remanded to October 12th.

They were served with warrants sworn out by Capt. Fraser, of the 5th Pioneer Battalion, charging them with damaging military property. These appeared before Judge Lanctot in chambers, and pleaded not guilty. They were admitted out on parole to appear for summary trial on Oct. 11.

SEVERE DEFEAT FOR TURKS.

Russians Have Resumed Their Offensive in Armenia.

Petrograd, Oct. 5.—Suddenly resuming their offensive in Turkish Armenia west of Trebizond, the Russians with the co-operation of the fleet, have inflicted a severe defeat upon the Turks, moving forward along a wide front, the War Office reported today.

A fortified position in the river Kara Burnu region has been captured and great losses inflicted upon the Turks. In stones and good in everything.

RUSSIANS CAPTURE CANNONS.

Petrograd, Oct. 5.—Six cannon have been captured by the Russians in their offensive movement with the Roumanians against the Teutonic allies, today's official bulletin announces. This capture of guns was in addition to seven taken by the Roumanians.

GREAT DEMONSTRATION IN HONOR OF LIBERAL LEADER

Meeting at St. Joseph's Boulevard Montreal Described by Mr. Frederick Yorston of the Montreal Standard.—An Enormous Crowd Clamored to Hear the Foremost Canadian—Striking Appeal.


It is one of the most interesting things in the world to go, with an open mind, to a great public meeting, especially when the central figure is a well known public man; to mix with the crowd, listen to the speeches and listen also to the remarks of those about you.

I had this experience at the great Laurier meeting on St. Joseph Boulevard, Montreal. I swayed back and forth in the very centre of those 25,000 struggling, excited, electors; and in my experience it was the most extraordinary political demonstration in the Province of Quebec—a province which makes a specialty of these demonstrations.

were set up draped pillars and at the top of each pillar was hung a gigantic bronze medallion of Sir Wilfrid, representing him at different periods of his great career. Around the platform were hung rows of electric lights and other illuminations which swung about in the wind, lighting up the wonderful spectacle. Huge banners and flags everywhere displayed and in the centre of all was a huge, golden, royal coat of arms, flanked by the flag of Britain, and those of all her gallant Allies.

The Crowds of Spectators.

Behind the dais rose gallery upon gallery of spectators to the very roof tops, where also eager listeners perch-

Long before the hour of the meeting the space in front of the platform was packed solid. I bored my way through this crowd from one of the outer edges until I arrived at a point about twenty yards from the speaker's dais. Here, for a couple of hours, I endeavored to keep my position, but was tossed to and fro, trampled on and jostled as the enthusiasm of the vast multitude found vent in prodigious movements.

An Ideal Night.

The night was an ideal one for a political meeting. The air was soft and balmy like that of a night in June; and there was just a suspicion of stars above the vast area of electric lights.

A great platform had been constructed and it creaked and groaned beneath the Liberal stalwarts, who packed every foot of its surface.

In the forefront of this platform

ed, dimly outlined in the night air.

The background to this great picture resembled nothing so much as one of Dickens' old London courtyards, with its galleries packed with spectators to witness some royal progress.

The veteran Liberal chieftain was visibly impressed by his vast audience. As I saw him from my vantage point, he smiled often at the crowd as men, women and children surged back and forth in the square as far as the eye could reach.

Sir Wilfrid wore a close fitting grey suit with black fedora hat and his complexion looked ruddy and healthy beneath the white plumes of his hair. A look at the chieftain was about all the majority of the throng got, as they stood packing the whole block between Fabre and Garnier streets, for it was quite impossible for the human voice


