

DESTROYED HIS CASH THEN SUICIDED

Strange Freak of a Malden Man--
Ended His Life on His Brother's
Grave.

Boston, Dec. 16.—Having destroyed between \$5,000 and \$7,000 in bills of large denominations, leaving in a bank only \$300 to defray his funeral expenses and having thrown his jewelry away, Gustavus A. Gardner, aged 29, who killed himself on his brother's grave in Holy Cross Cemetery, Malden, late on Wednesday afternoon, will be buried according to his last wish.

His action on the part of Gardner was discovered in a letter which was found among his effects at the Hotel Bellevue, as directed in another letter which asked Richard C. Kirkby, an East Boston undertaker, to bury him.

In the long letter the young man stated that the money he had destroyed had belonged to his dead mother and brother, and that in consequence he could not spend it nor bear to leave it behind, hence its destruction.

Until he left Boston a year ago, Gardner was the private secretary of the Boston Athletic Association. His friends say his mind must have become unbalanced.

TURKISH WOMEN LEAVING HAREM

New York, Dec. 16.—“War in bringing the Turkish woman, feminine mystery of the ages, out of the harem and from behind her veil, and when she stands revealed the world will be astounded at her superior intellect and progressive spirit,” said Miss Mary Mills Patrick, home from Constantinople. Miss Patrick is president of the Constantinople College for Women.

“Our idea that life in a harem is one continuous debauch could not be further from the truth. The women of Turkey, as a class, are splendid women. They are not frivolous, nor petty, nor empty minded, nor dull.

“The veil and the secluded life are no more acceptable to the Turkish women than they would be to a stenographer in Chicago or a dry goods saleswoman in San Francisco.

“They do not countenance immorality and fast living any more than millions of good women in the United States and their standards are quite as high and noble as those of any women in the world.

“These women, particularly as to their brain capacity and self-reliance, are greatly misunderstood by the men and women of America. As a class they possess an unusual degree of intelligence and initiative; and when they have fully come into their own the world will be astounded at their high station.

“I attribute the high standard of intelligence among them to the fact that ever since the sixth century these women have had absolute control of their property, both as to administration and disposition, from the time they were 15 years old.

“They are now in revolt against their archaic marriage laws and will, I think, succeed in having them readjusted in a short time.”

FRENCH HAVE TAKEN 9000 PRISONERS

Paris, Dec. 16.—The bulletin on the campaign issued by the War Office tonight reads:

“On the right bank of the Meuse our troops continued their success. They progressed in the Caurieres Wood and captured the village of Bezonvaux yesterday. At the close of the day a violent German attack directed against our positions on Cote du Poivre (Pepper Hill) was brought up short by our fire.

“We have maintained in its entirety our new front. Prisoners continue to be brought back, the number exceeding 9,000, of which 250 are officers. The enumeration of the material which has fallen into our hands has not yet been completed, but the computation shows that up to the present 81 guns have been taken or destroyed.”

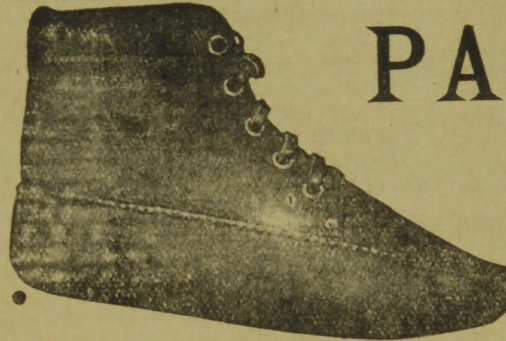

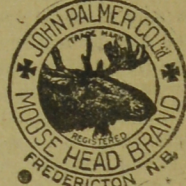

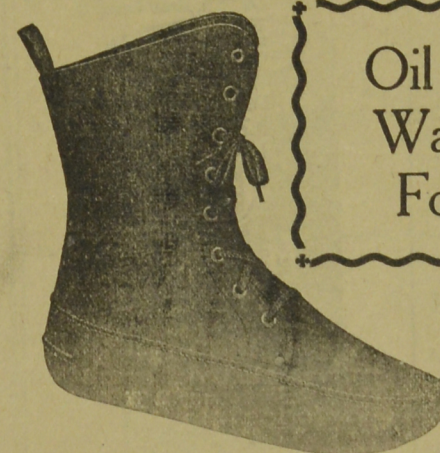
