BANKS PROTESTED AND VALUATION WAS LOWERED

Kicks Produced Reduction of \$3000
---Further Activity in Taxes.

The City Treasurer's Office is now busy clearing up all the details of the tax collections of the discount period. When these are ready the Finance Committee will meet and consider them. It is probable that action will be taken at this meeting concerning the further collection of arrears taxes. One feature of the payment of taxes during the discount period was the protest of two banks with branches here against the valuation placed upon their buildings. The Bank of Nova Scotia and the Royal Bank of Canada were those that protested. In the case of each a valuation of \$25,000, real estate, had been placed.

The Board of Assessors, after hearing the protests, reduced each valuation by \$3,000.

To Reorganize The British Camps

London, Aug. 27.—Consequent upon his recent visit to headquarters in France, the Canadian Minister of Militia will spend this week at the Canadian camps at Bramshott and Shorncliffe. He will be accompanied by Lord Dundonald, formerly General Officer Commanding the Canadian Militia.

Several new appointments will be made at the camps. In fact a thorough reorganization will be the result of the minister's visit.

The Duke of Devonshire and Sir Sam Hughes will be guests at a dinner to be given on Wednesday by members of the Anglo-Canadian colony in London.

Fighting on the Macedonian Front

London, Aug. 28.—Artillery fighting is in progress along the Macedonian front but no infantry action of importance is under way, so far as indicated by today's official account of the operations on this front.

Bremen en Route To United States

Berlin, via wireless to Sayville, Aug. 27.—According to the Cologne Gazette, as quoted by the Overseas News Agency, the German merchant submarine Bremen is now on her way to the United States with a cargo of dyes.

There have been many reports concerning the Bremen, whose arrival at an American port has been expected for some time. Last week passengers arriving from England gave a report that she had been captured by the British.

PRIVATE I. S. BURNS DIED IN HALIFAX

Remains Will be Brought Here For Interment---Served in R. C. R.

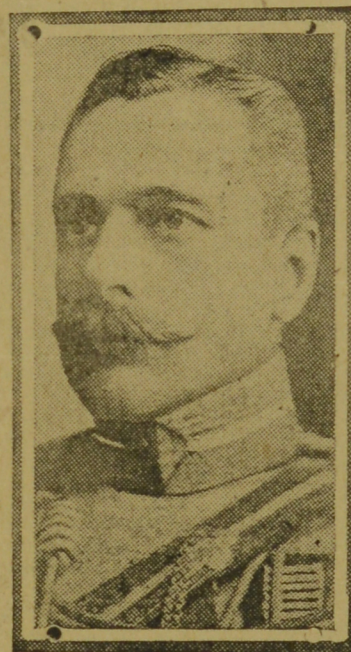
The remains of Private T. S. Burns, who passed away in Halifax from cancer of the stomach, will arrive here tomorrow by C. P. R., and will be taken to the home of Mr. Daniel Gorman, Odell avenue. An escort from the 62nd Fusiliers detachment at St. John will come here for the funeral.

A pipe band also will come. A widow and five children survive. The deceased served here for many years in the Royal Canadian Regiment, and was a member of the band. He was known then as "Bobby" Burns. He was about forty-five years old having enlisted in 1884 at the age of thirteen. The funeral will take place Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock. Rev. Mr. McLeod will conduct the service and interment will be made at the Pickard burying ground, Douglas.

At the time of his death he was in the 193rd Highlanders, having transferred from the R. C. R.

GERMAN PRIZE CREW MUST QUIT THE TEMP

London Aug. 28.—A Reuter despatch from Stockholm says that the German prize crew which early this month took the Swedish steamship Temp, captured by German warships, into the Swedish port of Gotland, owing to shortage of coal, has been ordered to quit the vessel. After long negotiations, the decision has been reached that the steamer and her cargo were not legitimate prizes.

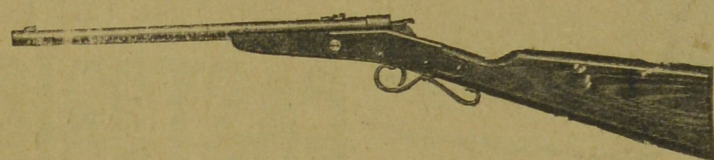
