**"BOBBY" LOGAN
WON QUARTER-MILE AND
MILE CHAMPIONSHIP****Canadians Won Majority
of Events in Eastern
Skating Meet--Fred
Robson Withdraws.**

Newburg, N.Y., Feb. 14.—Because of protests lodged against them by New York Athletic Club skaters, Anton Olskey, the Cleveland speed skater, and Fred Robson of Toronto, retired from the competition here today in the eastern skating championships. The Cleveland man's withdrawal was in a measure due also to trouble in his leg, caused by an accident at Saranac. He skated in one heat and easily outdistanced his field, but did not start again. The protest was against the receipt of post entries.

"Bobby" Logan of Montreal, captured two of the three main events—the quarter and mile championships. He fell in the final of the half mile. This was won by Walter Kubne of New York. Two thousand persons saw the races, which were skated in a driving storm.
