LEONARD-DUNDEE
BOUT NOT LIKELY
TO COME OFF

Boxing Commissioners Must decide--Leonard's Manager says No Agreement was Made.

Johnny Dundee and Bonnie Leonard are billed to meet in New York next Wednesday night, but it looks as if the bout will not take place. The New York promoter complained to the Boxing Commission that Leonard was not going to keep the engagement, and the commissioners have warned Leonard that if he does not box Dundee on that date he will be suspended for six months.

Leonard's manager declares he has made no agreement to box Dundee. The matter is to be threshed out before the commissioners. It looks as if one set of promoters is battling against another. Pollok, et al, of Brooklyn, have Leonard signed to box Freddie Welsh June 15 and they do not want Leonard to box Dundee before that bout. The Madison Square Garden Club has Leonard billed to meet Dundee and is making the fight to stop Leonard from passing up the bout.

DILLON MATCHED TO FIGHT

New York, June 5.—Frank Moran of Pittsburg, and Jack Dillon of Indianapolis, were matched tonight to box at Washington Park, Brooklyn, June 23.

Moran and his trainer, Willie Lewis, arrived at Saratoga Lake today to train for the fight with Dillon. Moran says he will receive \$20,000 and forty per cent. of the receipts and that Dillon will be paid \$10,000 and twenty-five per cent.

FOR HALIFAX TRACK

Natal Day Races to Have Several Other Classes--Some Good Racing is Expected.

A great horse racing card has been published to take place on the exhibition track in Halifax on Natal Day, June 21. The star event of the meet will be a match race between Bob Mac, 2:13 1/2, and Rex Heart, 2:14 1/2, mile heats, three in five, for \$1000. In connection with this race there will be a 2f25 class, trot and pace, purse \$300, in which trotters are allotted three seconds; also a free-for-all trot and pace, purse \$100. The latter race is open to horses owned by residents of Halifax county, (Halifax city owned horses barred).

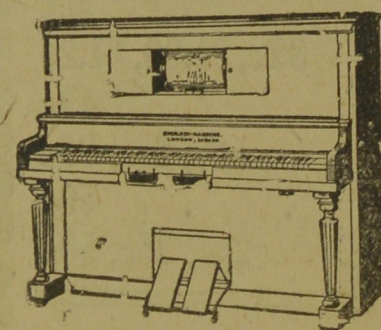

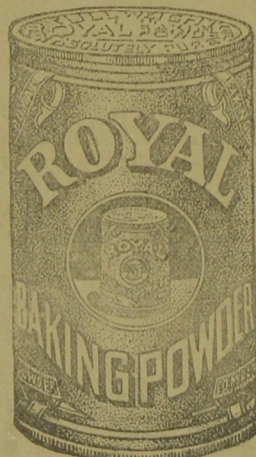
