a summary of the evidence taken by the commissioners. The report of the Commission at the outset states:

"We see nothing in the letter of General Hughes asking the Shell Committee for a shell contract for his home town of Lindsay to suggest the exercise of influence or pressure in the awarding of contracts. It was a most natural and in no way improper thing for the Minister to call the attention of the Commission to claims of manufacturers of the constituency he represents, to consideration."

Could Have Been Made in Canada.

After dealing with fuse contracts, the report says: "What we have said as to the time fuses does not apply to the graze fuses. Undoubtedly that type of fuse could have been produced in Canada within the time required, by Canadian manufacturers, as has been demonstrated by what they, and especially the Russell Motor company, have since done."

Claim to Have Sunk Two Submarines

Berlin, July 21, (via wireless to Sayville).—The destruction in the northern Adriatic on July 15 of two submarines, one of them an Italian, by Austrian torpedo boats, is announced in an official communication received here today from Vienna.

Russians Retire On Volhynic Front

Berlin (via Sayville), July 21.—A retirement of the Russians in the one sector of the Volhynia front is reported in the Austro-Hungarian army headquarters report of July 20.

British Steamer Sunk by Submarine

Algiers, July 21 (via London).—The British steamship Grangemoor, 3,198 tons gross, and owned by the Moor Line of Newcastle, has been sunk by a submarine. Her crew have landed.

meeting held at St. John yesterday. One result of this was the appointment of a special committee of three to wait upon the Provincial Government and ask that active measures be taken to stimulate recruiting. It was pointed out at this meeting that Fredericton is the only municipality of the province which has taken advantage of recent legislation to have a military census.

The policy of permitting new units to recruit while New Brunswick battalions at Valcartier are 1,150 men under strength was strongly criticized.

By resolution it was decided to ask revisors and school secretaries to prepare lists of names of men of military age in their districts.

New Vault Almost Ready.

The work of installing the new vault at the City Hall is rapidly nearing its close. The door of the vault was placed in position yesterday and the masonry is completed. Painters and decorators are still to do their work. The new structure is much larger than the old one, and takes up considerable space in the City Clerk's office.

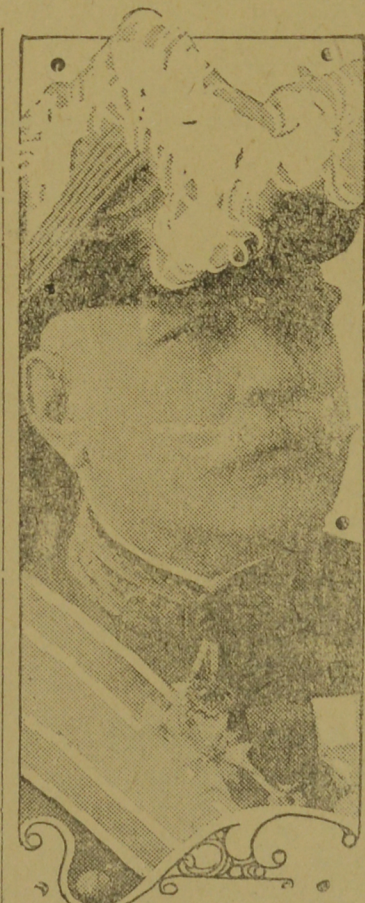

TO MAKE REPRISALS AGAINST THE TURKS
