pare for his trial.

J. B. Coyne, K. C., in moving for sentence, urged the advisability of a substantial fine being imposed, as well as a prison term, to make of the case a proper deterrent for others.

About a Million Dollars Stolen.

Mr. Coyne declared that in the neighborhood of a million dollars had been stolen. He called attention to the widespread nature of the conspiracy, to "the trail of crimes" which marked its progress, to the "corruption of officers of the Government," "perjuries" 'and "bad workmanship" on the building. He said three years was entirely inadequate for the purpose of deterring others from similar offences. Coyne advised imposing also "a large fine." which would deter others and reimburse the province in part for expenses

Edward Anderson, K. C., speaking on pehalf of Kelly, declared that the contractor was "the victim of a system" of long standing, for which society at large was responsible; a system which had been "tolerated and approved," he said, by a large section of the public, of providing campaign funds for the political parties out of Government contracts. He urged that Kelly be released on suspended sentence, spoke of the 'implacability" of the Crown throughout the case, and closed his remarks with an appeal for mercy, speaking of the suffering already borne by Kelly
