## BERLIN WANTS VON PAPEN'S PAPERS PUBLISHED IN FAC SIMILE

BERLIN, Jan. 21.—Another statement in defence of Captain Franz Von Papen, former German military attaché at Washington, was made today by the Overseas News Agency, as follows: "A wireless despatch from England says that the letters, checks and vouchers which were taken from Capt. Von Papen by the British at Falmouth, in violation of international law, are to be published. It is to be hoped that they will be reproduced in fac-simile, because it will then be evident that Captain Von Papen never made a payment to Werner Horne, who is accused of having attempted to blow up a Canadian Pacific railway bridge."

"It is interesting to note that in the British wireless reports the accusation that Captain Von Papen was connected with any plots to blow up ammunition works in the United States apparently has been dropped. The case of Horne is singled out. It is solemnly stated in the British wireless despatches that the letter and other documents taken from Capt. Von Papen were seized because they were personal belongings, which were not protected by the safe conduct guaranteed to him. If this is really the British idea, everybody in Germany will regret that it was not known before, for in that case the archives of the British Embassy might have been seized after the beginning of the war. No doubt they would have brought to light interesting information concerning the policy carried on for years against Germany."

### MONTENEGRINS HAVE ESTABLISHED THEIR SEAT OF GOVERNMENT AT SCUTARI

Newspaper despatches from Vienna by way of Switzerland and Paris report the renewal of active operations by the Austrians against the Montenegrins. One Austrian army is declared to be marching along the Adriatic towards Antivari, the seaport of Scutari, Albania, while detachments of the Austrian forces are said to be within 15 miles of Scutari itself.

Recent despatches have stated that the Montenegrin government has been established at Scutari. The declaration in a Vienna despatch received today denying the reports that the peace negotiations between Austria and Montenegro had been broken off may be explained by the fact that the despatch was a belated one filed yesterday, as the advices from the Montenegrin side continue to indicate the contrary. A Paris message today reiterates the declaration that Montenegro has decided to fight to the end, the announcement coming from the Montenegrin consul.

### VESSELS WERE SEIZED IN SWEDISH WATERS

Stockholm, Jan. 19, via London.—The Swedish government has lodged a protest in Berlin against the seizing by Germans of the steamships Capella and Hihur, which were captured two months ago. It is declared that investigations show that both vessels were taken in Swedish waters. The immediate delivery of the steamships and their cargoes is demanded. When these ships arrived at Stettin before the prize court met, all the crews were sent home and it is said that the special purpose of this was that the captains should have no witnesses. It was also reported on Nov. 8 last that German torpedo boats and a German submarine had taken the Swedish steamship Capella, bound for Denmark with a cargo of machinery, and had taken her into Swinemunde, where the cargo was unloaded. The Swedish newspapers stated that the vessel had been seized in Swedish territorial waters on December 24, 1915. Announcement was made that the Swedish steamship Hildur has been seized off Sandhammarer lightship, within Swedish territorial waters. Some of the Swedish papers stated that such actions are worse than an open rupture.

### REPORT THAT VILLIA HAS BEEN CAPTURED

El Paso, Texas, Jan. 21.—Persjsten reports that Francisco Villa, the outlawed military chief, had been captured at San Ceremimo, Chihuahua, by the Carranza general, Cavazos, were denied early today by General Luis Herrera at Chihuahua City, commander in the absence of General Jacinto Trevino, who has gone to Terreon. The report came to the border in a private telegram from what was believed to be a reliable source and was given credence generally.

### NO HOPE FOR RECOVERY.

Hope for the recovery of Arthur Munn of Haynesville, whose skull was crushed by a falling tree in the lumber woods on the Clearwater, has been abandoned. The young man was operated on at the Victoria Public Hospital in this city a few days after the accident and rallied well. It was expected that he would recover but a few days ago complications set in and there is now little possibility that he will live.

### THE WHEAT MARKET IS SHOWING STRENGTH

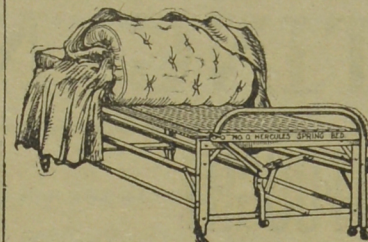
Chicago, Jan. 21.—Wheat developed strength today, influenced by reports of an urgent demand at Liverpool and by the announcement that clearances from Argentina and Australia continued to be light. There were advices also that for the first time in six months the Government of Holland was negotiating for American flour. The opening which ranged from 1/4 to 3/4 higher with May at 129 3/4 and July at 122 1/2 to 3/4, was followed by a reaction but then by a fresh upturn.

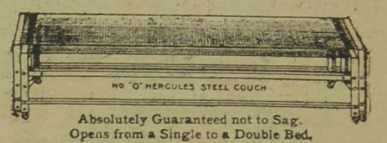
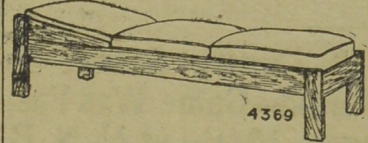
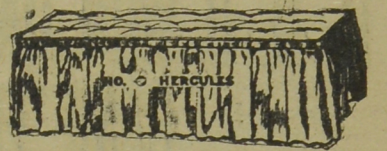
