**ORDER HAS BEEN
RESTORED IN ATHENS**

London, Dec. 4.—Order has been restored in Athens, and all civilians and soldiers off duty are being disarmed, according to a semi-official statement issued at Athens yesterday afternoon. This statement, as forwarded by the correspondent of Reuters, is as follows:

"Last night was perfectly quiet, so the city is resuming its normal aspect. By order of the commander of the garrison of Athens, all civilians and soldiers off duty are being disarmed. The departure of the French detachment from the capital is following the consent of the Hellenic government to hand over six batteries to Vice Admiral Du Fournet. A committee of Greek and French officials is investigating the reasons why Greek troops came to blows with the Allies, despite direct orders to the contrary."

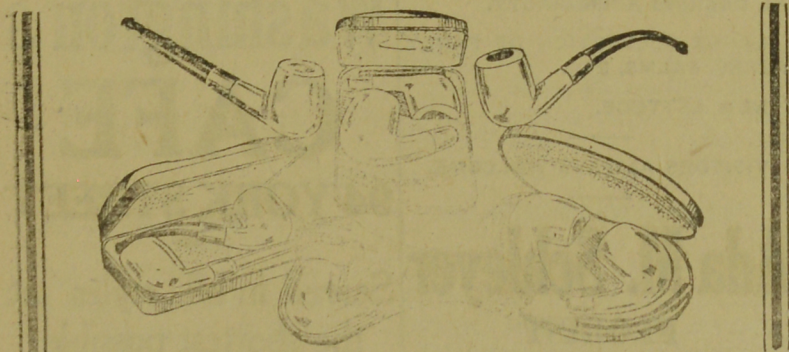

**GERMANS NOT DEPORTING
SO MANY BELGIANS**

Amsterdam, via London, Dec. 4.—The newspaper Les Nouvelles says the Germans are beginning to reduce considerably their requirements to the number of unemployed to be deported from Belgium, and that the greater part of the men who presented themselves at Liege last week were sent back to their homes. Only a few men were taken from the surrounding villages.

The Newspaper adds that apparently the protests of neutrals have begun to produce some effect. Invalids and boys of fifteen years who have returned to Ghent, report they were forced to work in trenches in the district of Hoissens.

**WATER COMMITTEE'S REPORT
CONTAINS MINOR ALTERATIONS****Committee Takes Blame For Some of
Conditions Complained of by City En-
gineer---Changes Made Which Are Ex-
pected to Produce Good Results---
Others Under Consideration.**

The following report on City Engineer McKnight's report on the Filtration Plant, the Pumping Station and Chief Engineer C. J. Bowers has been prepared by the Water Committee.

Ald. Everett, chairman of the committee, presented it to the City Council last night:

"Hir Worship the Mayor and Aldermen.

Your Water Committee beg to report as follows:

1. A report from the City Engineer dated November 27th has been carefully read and considered with the City Engineer and Chief Engineer of the Pumping Station. In the first place this Committee has unanimously affirmed and adopted the City By-laws which among other subjects declares that the City Engineer, under the direction and with the approval of this standing Water Committee, shall have general supervision and control of this Department, and communicate to the officers and employees in charge any and all orders of the City Council and of this Committee, and it shall be the duty of the said officers and employees to carry into effect any and all orders and directions by them so required in the manner prescribed by the City Engineer.

2. In the second place, this Committee does not consider that they have been entirely blameless in the lack of interest mentioned by the City Engineer, but after a lengthy consultation with the City Engineer and the Chief Engineer of the Pumping Station, we do believe that we have started certain machinery in motion that will bring about harmonious and efficient service in the operation of the plant.

3. In regard to the complaint of the City Engineer about the cutting of the grass at the Pumping Station, this friction arises largely from the failure of your Committee to notify the Chief Engineer and the Engineers of the Pumping Station that they were to receive directions from the City Engineer.

4. Further referring to the washing of the filters, the wastage of water around the displacement plungers, and to the pounding of the centrifugal pump, repairs have been made and they are now giving efficient service.

5. Regarding the application of the chemical solution to the water, that matter is now under consideration.

6. In regard to the individual pump recommended by the City Engineer, we have had same installed and it is now showing a considerable reduction in expense.

7. In connection with the cleaning of the coagulation basin, we coincide with the views of the City Engineer.

8. Referring to amount of chemical used, we feel that this is a very important matter, but as to whether a reduction of quantity used can be secured or not will depend largely upon future experiments.

9. Regarding the two final charges in the Engineer's report, viz., the shortage of water in the clear water basin on June 14th and 16th last, and the filing of the monthly reports, we have arrived at the conclusion that the reforms anticipated for the future will remedy these defects.

10. The suggestions of the City Engineer for the separation of the Engineering and Chemical departments of

the plant is now under consideration of your committee; but we do not think it advisable to recommend immediate action.

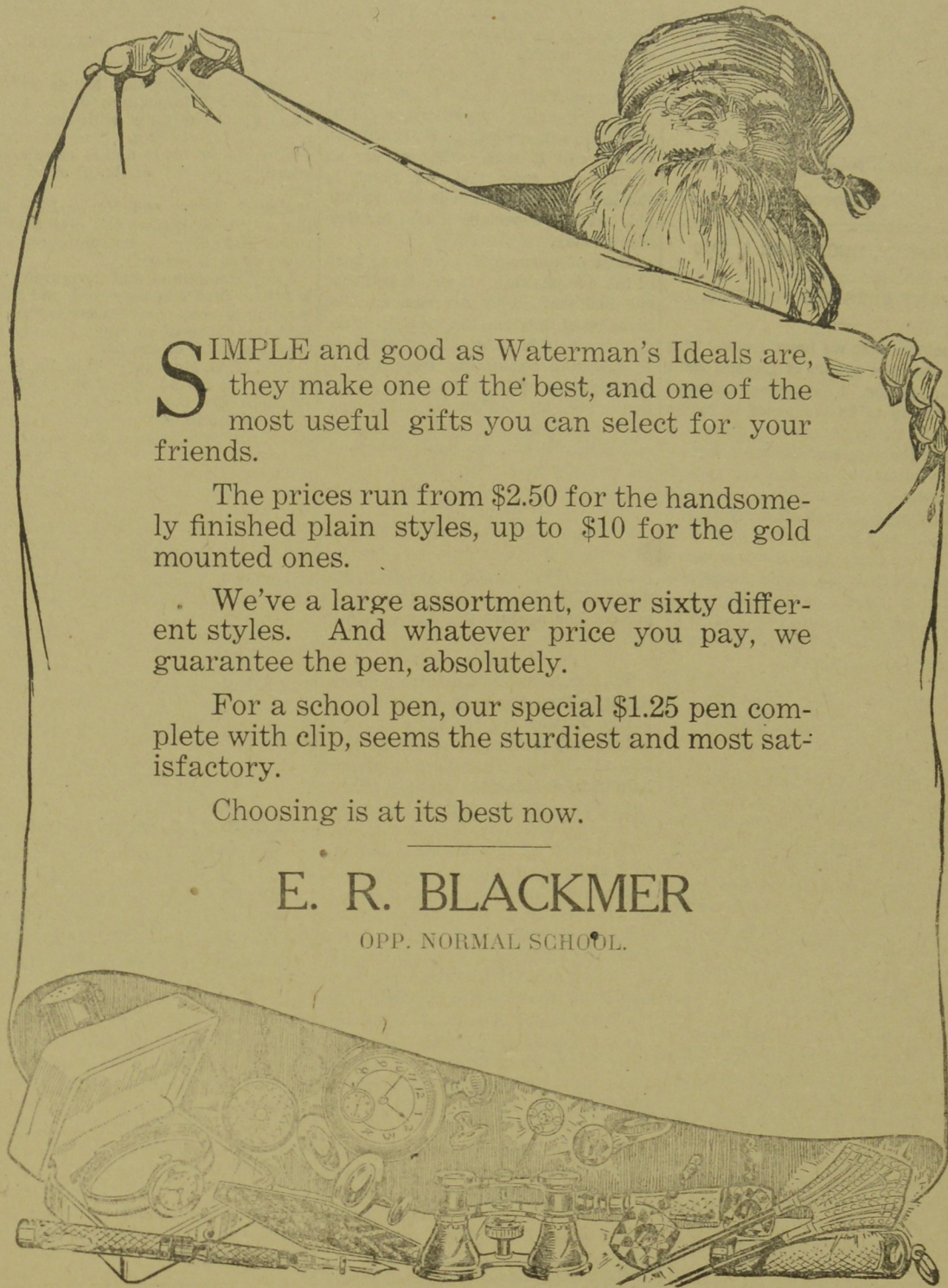
GOLDEN WEDDING.

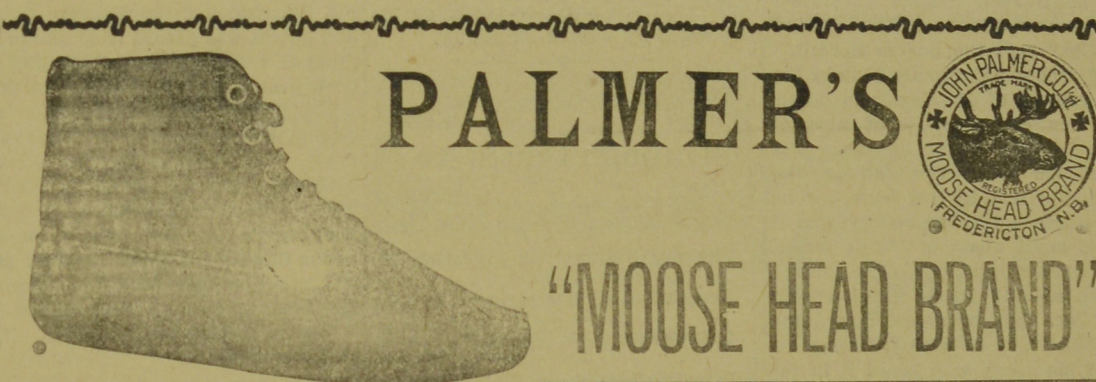

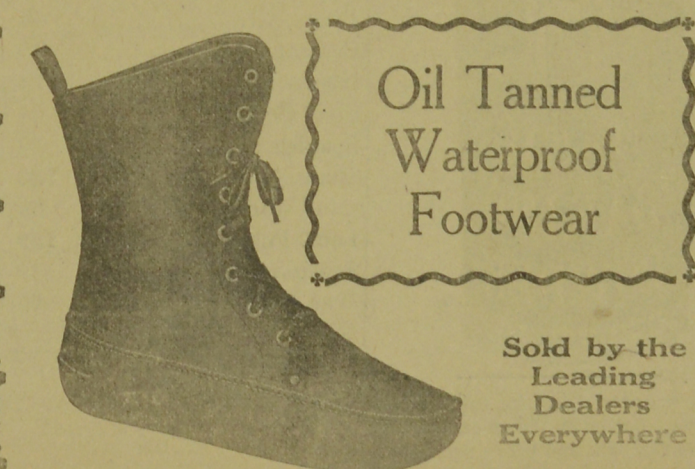
