HOUSEHOLD HELPS.

When a cup of strong tea is required, instead of putting an extra spoonful into the pot, add a spoonful of sugar. This opens the leaves of the tea and makes it stronger.

When cooking rice, add a little lemon juice; it will make the rice white and separate the grains.

To tell a good egg, put it in cold water. If the large end turns up it is not fresh.

To freshen meat which seems a little stale, add a pinch of soda to the water in which it is cooked.

Have round steak ground at the store so you can see what goes into your hamburger steak. The cheaper cuts are very nutritious.

Cold water extracts the juice from meats and slow cooking makes them tender.

Casserole cooking is delicious and nourishing, as it retains the flavor, and juices do not go to waste. An agate pan, well covered, is as good as a casserole.

HOUSEHOLD RECIPES

Christmas Fruit Cake.

One pound butter, 1 pound

brown sugar, 10 eggs, 1 teacup brandy, 1 teacup molasses, 6 teacups flour sifted, 2 pounds currants 2 pounds raisins seeded, 1 pound citron sliced, cut very thin, 2 teaspoons clove, 2 teaspoons nutmeg, 2 teaspoons mace, 1 teaspoon soda dissolved in a little warm water.

Cream butter and sugar, add eggs that have been beaten very light, then brandy, molasses and flour. Add fruit that has been rubbed through some of the flour, then the spices. When all are mixed add the soda. Mix thoroughly. This makes four loaves the size of any ordinary breadpan. My advice is to mix with the hands in a very large dish. Bake in a very slow oven for two hours.

Creamed Celery.

Remove the leaves and small stalks from two heads of celery, wash and cut in half-inch lengths. Boil in salt water until tender. While the celery is boiling, make a sauce of one cupful of cream or thick milk and one tablespoonful of butter mixed with flour. Boil the sauce until it is smooth and thick. When the celery is ready, drain and place in a dish, pour over the sauce and serve.

ROW OVER PATRONAGE IN NOVA SCOTIA

(Truro News.)

Mr. Frank Stanfield, as one of our provincial representatives, for some time has complained that recommendations that he has made on behalf of his brother, Col. John Stanfield, M. P., for positions in the railway service, have been ignored by those at the head of the railway department.

The "last straw" came when he recommended Mr. J. D. McNutt, a Colchester man of long experience and a perfectly competent official, for the position of assistant superintendent at Truro, and this recommendation was ignored, and our former Grand Trunk official received the appointment.

When this appointment was made, Mr. Stanfield at once sent his resignation as a representative of Colchester county in the Provincial Legislature, to Mr. George McNutt, Stewiacke, the president of the Liberal Conservative Association of the county.

President McNutt will at once call the Liberal Conservative Association together to consider this resignation.

RECRUITING ON UP GRADE.

Nearly 3,000 Men Enlisted in Canada in the Past Fortnight.

Ottawa, Dec. 4.—Recruiting in Canada is on the upgrade. With one division, Alberta, to hear from, a total of 2,698 men enlisted in the fortnight between Nov. 18th and 30th, as compared with 2,374 in the fortnight previous.

Alberta will add about three hundred to the above total. The Ottawa division leads all others.

U BOAT FAILED IN THIS CASE.

London, Dec. 4.—Lloyds Shipping agency announces that British steamship Eggesford, previously reported sunk by a submarine, has been picked up at sea and brought to Brest by a government tug. She is a steamer of 3,556 tons.

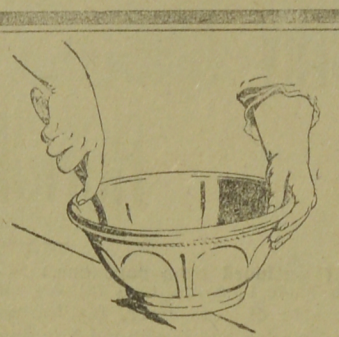
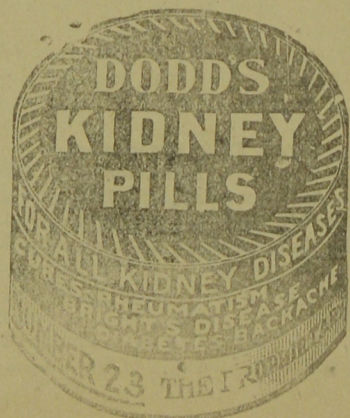
HOME ARMY BILL CAUSED PANIC.

German Women Protest Against Being Forced Into Factories.

London, Dec. 4.—The passage of the Home Army bill caused a panic throughout Berlin last week when it was realized that women would be forced into the factories, according to an Amsterdam despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Co.

The despatch says there was a demonstration of women, mostly servants and wives of soldiers, outside of Charlottenburg town hall, which protested against the provisions of the measure and demanded bread and two days leave for all soldiers. "The women also demanded peace," the despatch says.

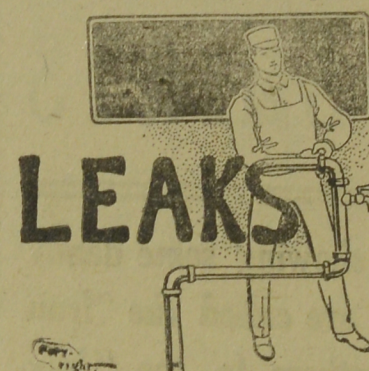
