FOUR FRENCH SOLDIERS HELD BACK A GERMAN REGIMENT

New York, April 14.—A special Paris cable to the World says:

Even in stories of individual gallantry at Verdun, soldier's names are not permitted, so the four heroes of the latest anecdote being narrated in Paris cannot be identified except as infantrymen of the line.

They were with their battalion in a specially hot corner of the Caillette woods a few days ago, when on a particularly dark night, after the usual frightful bombardment they dimly perceived compact masses of Germans rising toward them from trenches forty yards away.

The command to fall back to the second line was unheard by the four soldiers, who instead ensconced themselves in an observation post and first with two rifles apiece, then with a copious store of hand grenades, held back successfully for several minutes an entire regiment of Germans.

Huns Were Amazed.

Apparently amazed at such unexpected resistance, the German commander ordered his men to seek shelter, while he despatched two patrols of six men each to reconnoiter on either wing. One of the patrols of six men approached within a few feet of the hidden Frenchmen before the latter let fire a fusillade of bombs. Five of the six were slain instantly, and the sixth begged for mercy.

Patrol Surrendered.

The other patrol, coming from another direction, saw the lone survivor standing with his hands above his head, and all promptly surrendered in turn.

Unwounded and without great difficulty, the four infantrymen marched their seven prisoners rearward and rejoined the main body of their unit in time to participate in a counter attack which flung the Germans far backward from the positions they occupied before that astonishing quartette stopped the advance of a whole regiment.

CRIMINAL ASSAULT

REPORTED FROM ST. MARY'S

Young Girl Named McCoy Said to Be in Serious Condition---
Accused.

A criminal assault on a girl named McCoy, aged 13 years, daughter of Mr. Andrew McCoy, of St. Mary's, is said to have taken place last night, with the result that she is in a serious condition with a physician in attendance.

The physician, when asked by the Mail this afternoon concerning the condition of the patient, said she was resting easily, but refused to make any further statement.

It was reported this morning that information would be laid against William Donahoe, of St. Mary's, for committing the offence, but up to three o'clock this afternoon Police Magistrate Limerick had received no information.

The story is that Donahoe, who is a private in C Company, 140th Battalion, accompanied the girl to a picture show and while they were returning to her home the offence is said to have been committed.

Constable Charles Barker heard loud cries. He rushed to his door, and the McCoy girl told him that a man had attacked her.

Mr. Barker accompanied her home. There she told her family further details, which resulted in a physician being summoned.

This morning a party of men from the 140th Battalion was sent to St. Mary's to arrest Donahoe, but up to early hour this afternoon had not located him. The offence, if proven, is a most serious one, with a possible death penalty.

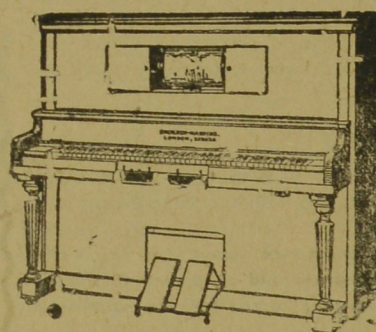

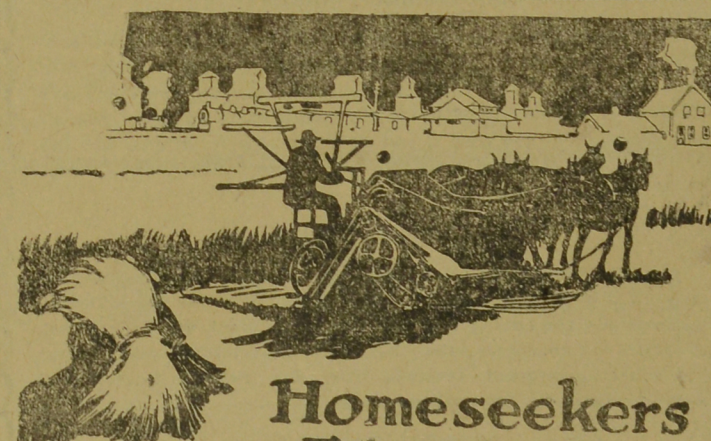
