### A STRONG APPEAL TO B. C. OVERSEAS TROOPS

Sir Hibbert Tupper and the Liberal  
Leader and Asks Them to Vote  
Against the Bowser Govt.

Vancouver, B.C., July 31.—Signed jointly by H. C. Brewster, Liberal leader, of British Columbia, and Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, the following message has been addressed to British Columbia soldiers at the front and at home:

"Representing, as we believe, the public sentiment of the province, we extend this message:

"To you is given the opportunity of offering your manhood in the defence of our country and the preservation of its institutions and ideals. To us at home falls the duty of maintaining those ideas and institutions in a way worthy of your splendid sacrifice. In the performance of this duty we believe a united effort should be made by the lovers of clean government and efficient administration, both Liberals and Conservatives, to drive from office the men who are misgoverning our province. Proud as we would be to take our places beside you on the field, and to offer our services and our lives in the common cause, we are prevented by circumstances from discharging that splendid duty. May our lesser part be performed equally well. The least we can do is to strain every effort toward the improvement of public conditions so that we may welcome you home to a province cleansed of that which is evil and mean and sordid, and blessed with fine ideals and good government.

"You will exercise your franchise with nothing but the most sincere desire for the welfare of British Columbia. We do not propose to discuss the issues upon which the future of the province depends, nor will we seek to influence you by promises. We have long known the record of the present government. Their tenure of office has been marked by extravagance, incompetency and wholesale corruption. A chance is now afforded to save British Columbia as you are rescuing unhappy Belgium. It is not a fight of parties, but of the people against official wrong doing. It is a fight in which not only all the Liberals, but many of the Conservatives, are united.

### HAVE NO LOVE FOR VON HINDENBURG

London, Aug. 4.—A Vienna despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Co. says: The announcement that the German Field Marshal Von Hindenburg had been appointed commander of the eastern front brought no joy in Austro-Hungary. Three Budapest papers were suppressed yesterday (Wednesday) owing to adverse criticism of the appointment.

It is stated here that the new commander in chief has already ordered the recall of a number of Austrian generals who will be replaced by German s. It is added that Austria, in acceding to the appointment, made the stipulation that Von Hindenburg must appoint a number of Austrian officers to his staff, but it is learned that only one such appointment will be made.

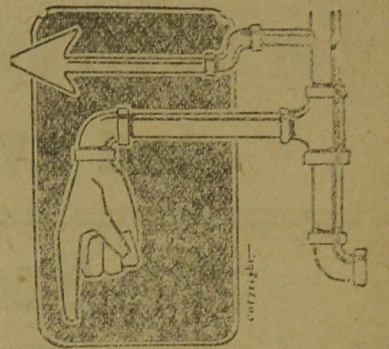

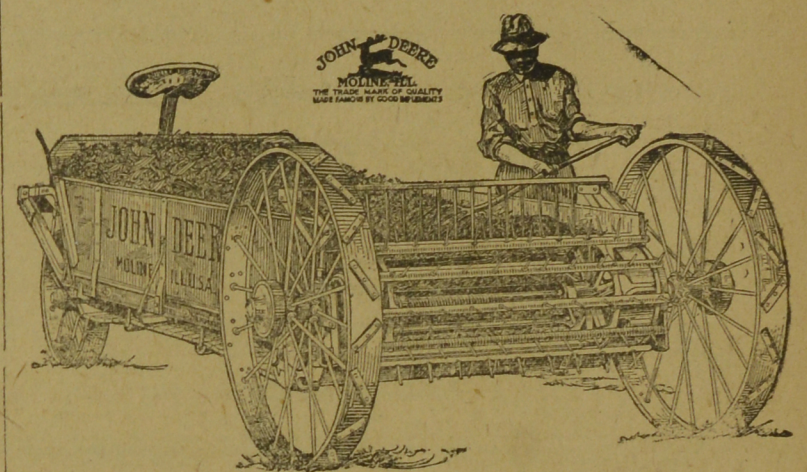

### AN AERIAL ATTACK ON SUEZ CANAL

London, Aug. 4.—A bombardment of shipping on the Suez canal by hostile aeroplanes was announced today in an official statement. The attack was carried out by two machines over Lake Timsah, 45 miles south of Port Said.

The town of Ismailia, on the lake border, also was bombarded. No damage was done by the bombardment in either case, according to the official statement.

### WILL TRY TO SETTLE BORDER DIFFERENCES

Washington, Aug. 4.—Elizéo Arrondo, Mexican ambassador designate, delivered a note to the State Department today replying to the last American communication to the de facto government and announcing the appointment of three Mexican members of a joint commission to undertake settlement of border differences.

### LIQUOR SPOTTER WORKS NEWCASTLE

There is great excitement in liquor selling circles in Newcastle, says a despatch to the Moncton Times, "over one Otto C. Mowry, of St. John, who, being employed by Chief of Police Finley for two weeks at \$30 a week and expenses to find out all who were selling liquor in town, has bought from some half dozen people and enabled Chief Finley to bring seven cases for violation of the C. T. A.

There is considerable indignation against Mowry as to his conduct in town. The cases brought include two charges for second offence. One of the parties has left town.

On Wednesday night Mowry was arrested on the charge of using insulting language to Fred Fleigher, tending to incite the latter to a breach of the peace. Another warrant is also threatened against him. Mowry was well recommended by St. John parties for whom he had worked.
