SOME FOX TRAPPER.

Relatives of Allison B. Carr of Woodstock, who disappeared some days ago, and is supposed to have been drowned in the river, are offering a reward of \$100 for the recovery of his body.

SUGAR GOES UP.

All grades of sugar were advanced ten cents per one hundred pounds today. There has been an advance of thirty cents per hundred pounds in ten days. Molasses has advanced three cents per pounds from the lowest point.

TRAIN DID NOT STOP.

Residents of Victoria Mill are indignant because the stop is not made by trains on the St. John & Quebec Railway at that station. This morning two women and three children, one a baby in arms, were left standing at the station as the train went by.

Mr. Harry Woods, M.P.P., who has been carrying a promise around in his pocket for two years, and who is also said to be an aspirant for Blair's job, is engineering the scheme.

Mr. Guy M. Burnett, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Burnett of Kings clear, died last night after a brief illness from typhoid and pneumonia. He was a bright young man and his death is generally regretted. The deceased was twenty years of age and is survived by his parents, two sisters and four brothers. The sisters are Misses Ella and Ethel and the brothers are Leslie, Charles, Donald and Lloyd. The funeral will take place Sunday afternoon, Rev. Mr. Mason conducting the service at the Baptist church, Kingsclear. Interment will be made at the Dunphy Burying Ground.

GUARD DISCHARGED
REVOLVER WHILE
MENTALLY DERANGED

Private Harold Duplisea of Fairville Fired Three Shots in Guard-Room Of Parliament Building--To Be Sent Home.

Private Harold Duplisea of Fairville, one of the returned soldiers acting as a guard at the Parliament Buildings in this city, became mentally deranged last night at about half past eleven and discharged a revolver in the guard room. Fortunately the three bullets from the weapon buried themselves in the walls of the room, which is located in the ground floor of the Education Office. The unfortunate soldier was taken to Victoria Public Hospital last night, and is reported now to be improved. He will be discharged from the hospital on Monday and will be sent home.

Mr. H. M. Blair, secretary of public works, notified Capt. L. P. D. Tilley by telephone of what had occurred. Capt. Tilley will consult with Duplisea's relatives as to what will be done with him.

This soldier is a victim of German "Kultur" as he suffered severely from being "gassed" in Flanders. Since that time he has been subject to attacks similar to that of last night. He also was wounded in the head while on service.

Private Duplisea's outbreak caused considerable excitement last night. The city police were summoned and it was suggested at first that he be taken to the police station. Private Doyle of Nelson, who was with Duplisea at the time of the shooting, explained that the man was in one of the fits to which he was subject and

SUPT. OF NURSES
AT VICTORIA HOSPITAL
MAY GO TO FRONT

Miss Grace Murray Asked to Join Queen Alexandra's Imperial Order of Nursing Sisters--Considering Offer.

Miss Grace Murray, who assumed the post of superintendent of nurses at the Victoria Public Hospital at the beginning of the present year, has received an offer to join the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Order of Nursing Sisters for service during the present war. Where Miss Murray would be sent on duty is problematical but probably would be in Europe.

When asked today by a reporter of The Daily Mail concerning the matter, Miss Murray said:

"I received instructions from Ottawa on Thursday to the effect that my services would be accepted with the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Order of Nursing Sisters. I am in communication with possible substitutes to fill my position here. My course of action will depend upon my securing a substitute and also upon the Board of Trustees of this hospital."

Miss Murray belongs to Doaktown, but before taking the position at the Victoria Hospital in this city had extensive experience in the United States. The nursing order which has asked for her services is an English organization which has called for recruits in Canada.
