GERMAN PAPER SUP-PRESSED FOR PLAIN TALK

Says Declaration That Germany Was Forced Into the War Cannot be Supported.

London, Aug. 3 .- According to the Daily Express, the following represents a translation of the part of the article for which the Berliner Tageblatt was suppressed:

"The declaration that this war was inevitable, and that Germany was forced into it unprepared and against her will, cannot be supported except by the most extreme partisans. Undoubtedly the conflict could have been avoided had the government desired to avoid it, and doubtless it would have been had the Reichstag been taken in to the confidence of our rulers instead of merely being presented with a re cital of actions taken independently of parliament.


