Thomas Hughes, an aged and highly respected resident of St. Mary's, passed away yesterday afternoon with tragic suddenness. He had been hauling wood from the rear of his farm to his residence, which is on the main street. One of his daughters observed that his horse had stopped at the C.P.R. railway crossing. As the horse did not move, she went to see what was the matter and found that her father had passed away in his seat on the sled. A young boy named Nash had passed him a short time before and spoken to him but had not noticed him particularly.

The deceased was aged eighty-two years and is survived by two sons and three daughters. The sons are Mr. Peter J. Hughes of the firm of McLellan & Hughes, barristers, of this city, and Mr. James A. Hughes, principal of the Regent Street School in this city. The daughters are Ros Ella and Mary, all at home. Mr. Peter Hughes of St. Mary's, is a brother, and Miss Theresa Hughes of St. Mary's, is a sister.

The funeral will take place Sunday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock. Rev. Father Cormier will conduct solemn service at St. Anthony's church. Interment will be made at the Hermitage.

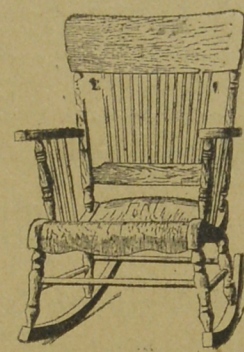

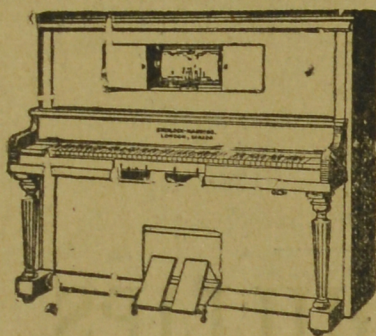
