PUTS UP \$13,500
FOR GRAND CIRCUIT

Five Early Closing Events Announced--The Three Heat Plan Adopted Except in Northrop.

Grand Rapids, Mich., March 9--Five early closing purses, which will total \$13,500 in value, are announced for the Grand Circuit meet here August 7 to 11. The purses:

Furniture Manufacturers' Stake, 2:08 trot, three heats, \$5000.

Grand Rapids Railway, for trotters that have never won \$2000 gross nor have a time race faster than 2:14 three heats, \$3000.

Comstock, for pacers eligible to the 2:12 class, three heats, \$3000.

The William, for pacers eligible to the 2:07 class, three heats, \$2000.

The Northrop Sweepstakes, for all two-year-old trotters, two heats, added money, \$500.

The three-heat plan will prevail in all the early closing events except the Northrop Sweepstakes, which will be raced in two heats.

WORLD'S HOCKEY
SERIES WILL BE
PLAYED AT OTTAWA

Portland Team of Pacific Coast League will Play Wanderers--March 21, 23 and 25.

Ottawa, March 9--William Foran, Stanley Cup trustee, stated last night that the games for the famous trophy between the Portland team and the champions of the N.H.A. would be played at Ottawa for Montreal, on March 21, 23 and 25.

The dates are satisfactory to the Westerners, but of course, will have to be changed in the event of the Ottawa and Canadian teams tying up, which is not likely.

The clubs will play under the two styles as was the case at the coast last year.

The first game will be under the six-man rule, with the second under seven, and the third under six. In any event, the majority of games will take place according to the Eastern code. The Western offside rule will also be a vogue in the second game.

Officials will be agreed on by the clubs and in the event of a dispute, Trustee Foran will name them. The Coast champions will leave for the East Sunday night and may play an exhibition match on the 18th against one of the N.H.A. teams. It would

AGAINST PROHIBITION

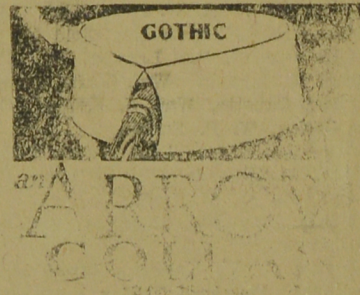

petitions to repeal. An official return which he had before him from the Deputy Provincial Secretary showed that there had been four elections in the last five years under the local option provisions of the Provincial Act. These had been held in Durham and Dalhousie, in Restigouche county; St. Hilaire in Madawaska county, and in Richibucto, Kent county, and two had resulted in favor of license and two against. There had been a territorial gain of nothing and those were the total efforts and the total results of practical temperance work in the province in five years. These returns showed that there were many people who were indifferent on the subject. When requested by pastor or friends they might vote for prohibition, but ask them to pay the tax that would be necessary for enforcing a prohibitory act and they would vote against the tax. He believed that temperance sentiment in New Brunswick and in Canada was increasing rapidly, but he knew that it was increasing as a result of moral training and suasion and because of the good work that was being done in the homes, churches, the Sunday schools, common schools and temperance societies. He wanted to give the temperance workers credit for what they were doing, but he did not agree with the extremists who desired to fight liquor blindly with physical force.

In England there was a very strong feeling against having an election during the war, and in Canada the inadvisability of an election had been recognized and the life of Parliament had been extended by consent. The reason for this feeling was that all attention was required for the question of how to win the war. The undivided energies and attention of all the brightest men in the country were needed, and anything that would cause a breaking up of the unity of purpose and harmony of action which there must be if the war was to be successfully prosecuted, was to be deplored. The records did not show that there was any emergency in the need for prohibition.

He did not wish to be regarded as being against prohibition, but the whole matter and the enforcement of the law was now in the hands of the people themselves, and he was opposed to bringing it back into the hands of the politicians and having it subjected to the cross-current of political expediencies. He appealed to the loyalty of the Government and the members of the House and the officers of the Dominion Alliance not to press the question of prohibition at the present time, but to give all their ability to assisting in bringing the war to a successful issue.

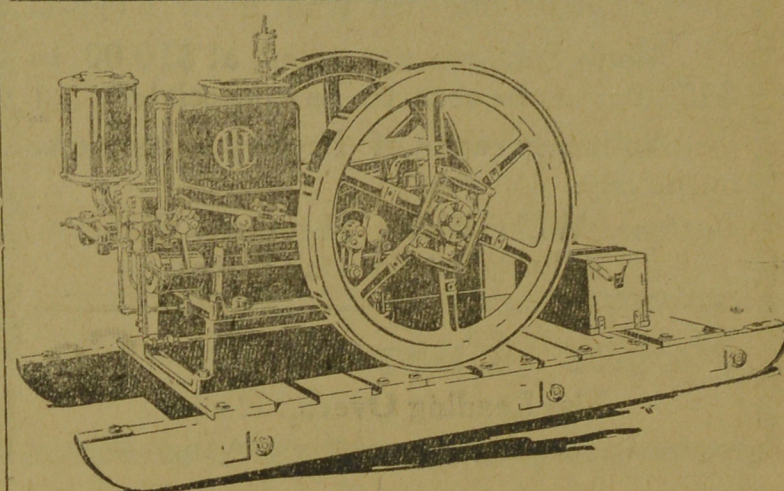
