### HAS NO MESSAGE

U. S. Government Asked to Assure Itself of German Submarine's Character.

Washington, July 10 .- The British and French embassies today officially called the State Department's attention to the arrival of the German super submarine Deutschland, and asked that the United States Government assure itself of the boat's character.

This will be done, it was announced, by the assignment of naval experts to assist the Treasury Department.

Submarine Entirely Unarmed.

The fact that boarding officers found Deutschland, wholly unarmed, goes far is a failure. towards simplifying any question as to her status as a merchant ship in American waters.

Officials realize, however, that the British and French embassies, while interested little in what the Deutschland has brought over, are concerned over the cargo of rubber and nickel she proposes to carry back to Germany, and expect that nothing will be left undone by Germany's enemies to prevent or hinder her clearance.


