open an additional department in this fine building, and it will contain Grades VII and VIII. All grades from one to eight will then be taught there.

School Boundaries.

Attempts have been made heretofore to establish boundaries for the different schools, but all the grades not having been taught in all the schools made this plan difficult.

However, arrangements have been adopted bringing this into effect with the reopening of the schools, and hereafter all pupils residing in the western section of the city from the upper side of York street, will find their school home either in York street or Smythe Street schools.

From the lower side of York street all pupils will attend the Charlotte Street School.

The Regent Street School and the Model School are open to all parts of the city, the latter by registration.

Applications for transfer from one school to another have been numerous lately and the new boundary regulation is not likely to evoke any complaint from the Secretary.

A letter was read from Chief Superintendent Carter in which he "expressed his very great appreciation for the Board's prompt action in availing itself of the provisions of the Act enabling it to send a delegate (Mr. Clark)

SCHOOL MEETING HELD LAST NIGHT

Addition to St. Mary's-Gibson School to be Built--New Trustees Elected.

The annual school meeting of St. Marys and Gibson took place last night and was largely attended. Mr. Ray Burpee was elected trustee in the place of Mr. Harry Pickard, resigned, and Mr. H. P. Lint was elected auditor.

The other trustees are Messrs. D. Blair and A. B. Neill. Mr. J. C. Machum is secretary.

The chief item of business was the decision to build an addition to the St. Marys-Gibson school to provide for the increased number of school children.

The annual school meeting of School District No. 1, Barker's Point, was held last evening. Mr. Henry Cosman was elected chairman. The report of Secretary F. L. Armstrong was received and adopted, it being the best and most complete and satisfactory furnished in some years.

A lengthy discussion took place in reference to the compulsory school law, and there was also quite a debate on the laws relating to the closing of schools while contagious diseases are in the district.

The assessment was left the same as last year, namely, \$450, which was lower than it had been for several years previously.

An interesting report was read in connection with the school closing exercises.

Mr. John Lipsett was elected as a trustee in place of Mr. Beven Hughes, whose term of office has expired. The board of trustees for the ensuing term is as follows: John Lipsett, E. G. Merritt, and F. L. Armstrong.

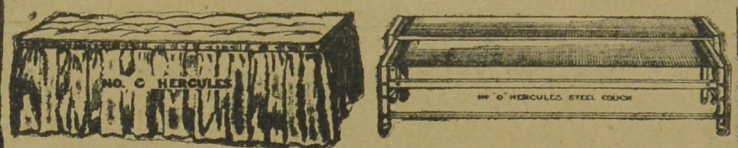
It was reported to the Board that Mrs. Clark's paper on the "Ideal School Board" was greatly enjoyed by her audience of 600 teachers and trustees.

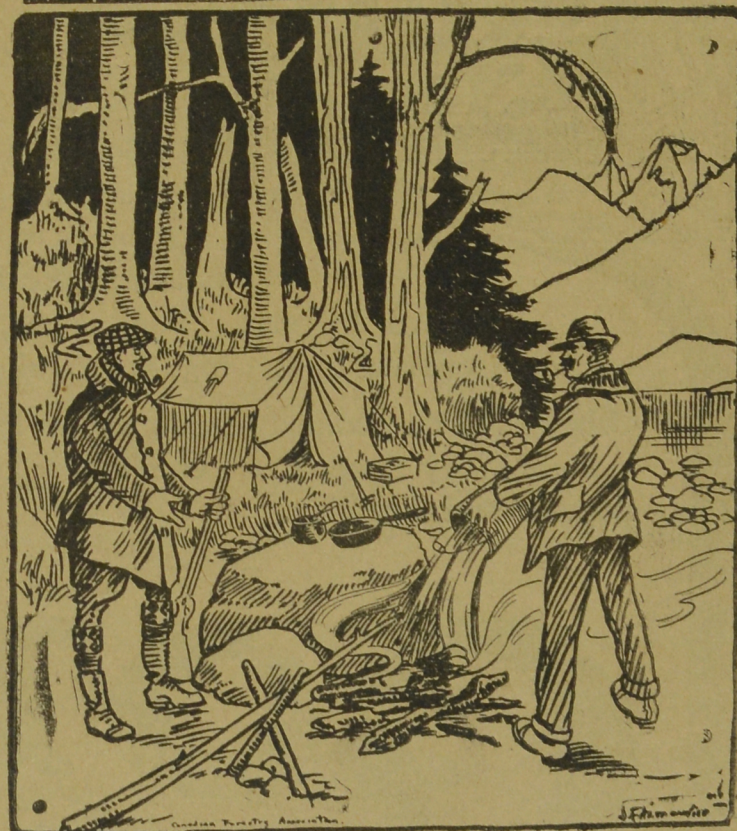
