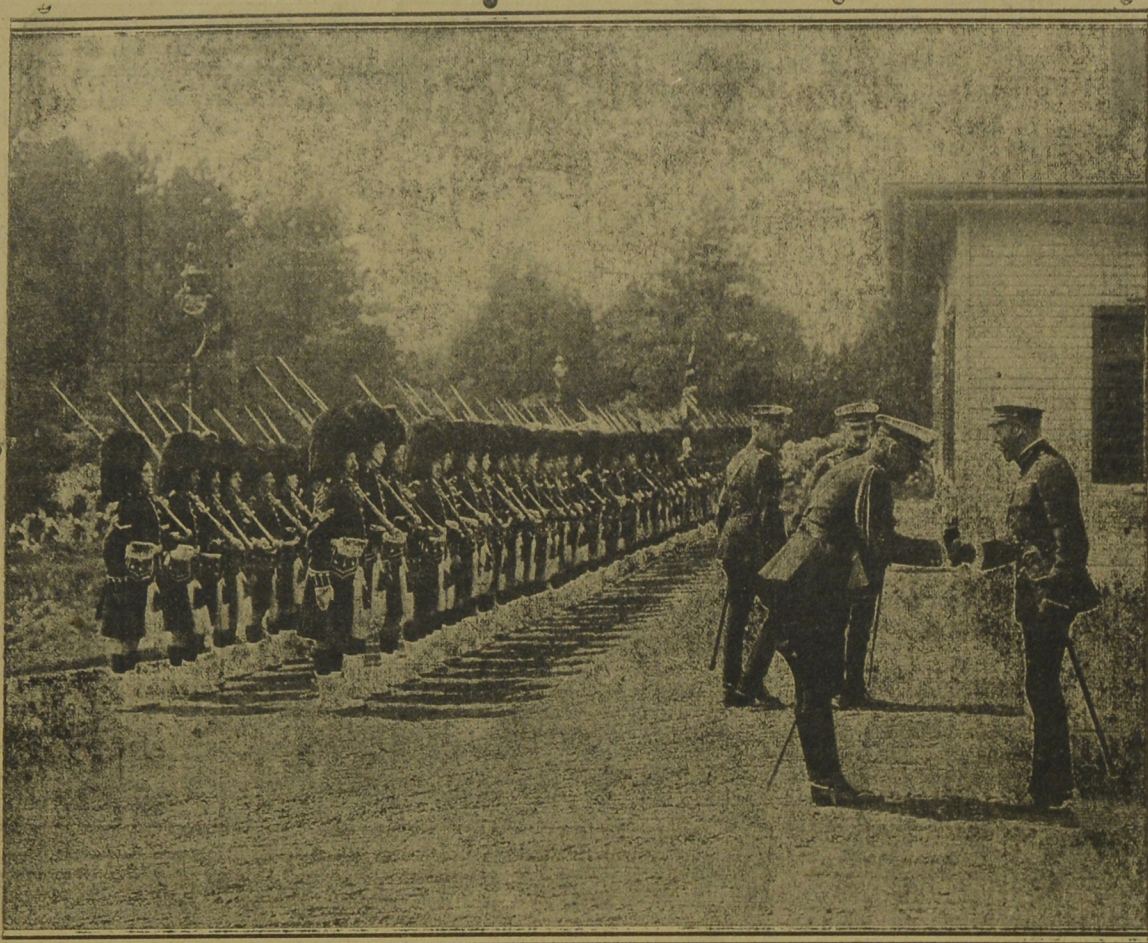


## THE KING INSPECTING TROOPS
