New York, Oct. 13.—France has for a year been producing 250,000 shells a day for the famous "75" guns, as compared with 12,000 daily when the war began, and R. E. Tardie, French high commissioner in the United States, said in a statement here yesterday, his estimate of credits voted by France from August of 1914 until America entered the conflict was nearly \$21,000,000,000, of which more than nineteen and a half billion came from the savings of the French people.

M. Tardie also said that in 1914 France had only three hundred heavy guns, organized in regiments. Now she has more than six thousand. Besides, she has given more than 800 heavy guns to Russia and Rommania and other allies.
