SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Flannel Cakes.

Sift together a cup of flour, a teaspoon of salt, a teaspoon of cream tartar and half a teaspoon of soda. Add two beaten eggs, one tablespoon of sugar, a pint and a half of milk and enough more flour to make a thin batter. Cook on a griddle.

Canned Cherry Dumplings.

Two cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking

powder, a little salt, 2 tablespoonfuls butter, mix well and make a soft dough with milk and water. Make little balls of the dough and in the centre of each place 1 tablespoon of canned cherries. Place in deep baking pan. Over the six dumplings put 1 cup sugar, butter size of egg, cherry juice and water. Bake 30 to 45 minutes. Serve hot with juice in which they are cooked.

Indian Meal Pudding.

One teaspoon lard, 2 quarts skim milk, 1 cup Indian meal, half a cup of sugar, half a cup molasses, 1 teaspoon salt. Melt lard, add 1 quart of the

milk. When this boils, remove from the stove and stir into it gradually the meal and sugar and salt sifted together, then add the molasses and the remainder of the milk. Stir all together. Bake in a deep pudding dish for four hours in a moderate oven. If milk is scarce, half water may be used with good results. Serve with whipped cream sweetened.

Celery Salad.

Cut celery into two-inch lengths. Slash one end of each piece lengthwise several times and put into iced water. The ends will curl back. Serve

on lettuce leaves with mayonnaise and stuffed olives.

Bread Griddle Cakes.

Two cups stale bread broken in bits, sour milk to cover. Let this stand until the bread is soft enough to mix in to a batter. Add 1 level teaspoon of soda, 1 teaspoon of salt, 1 tablespoon of sugar, a tablespoon of dripping, 1 cup of white flour and enough sour milk or sweet milk to make a thin batter. Bake the cakes on a griddle and serve hot with syrup.

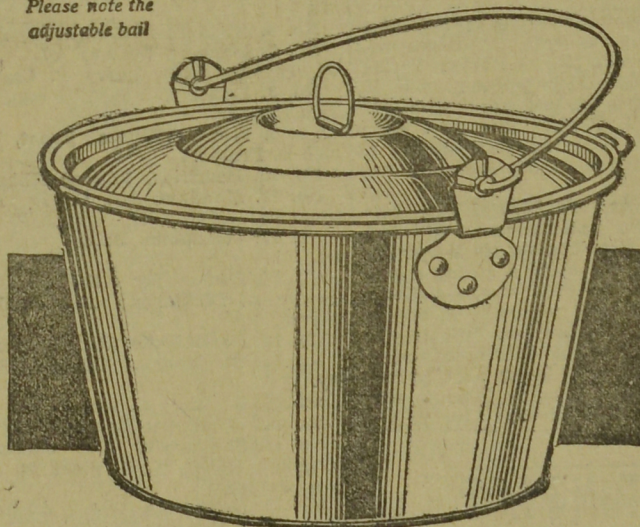
