

SANDWICHES AND SALADS.

They're Always in Season, and There is No End to the Ways of Making Them.

Ribbon Sandwiches.

Cut the bread in thin slices lengthwise, butter and put together, having a slice of graham between two slices of white bread. Trim and cut crosswise.

Brunette Sandwiches.

Slice Boston brown bread thin, butter lightly and spread with cottage or cream cheese. Dip crisp lettuce leaves in a bowl of French salad dressing, then lay on the already spread brown bread. Press another slice of buttered brown bread on this, and the sandwich is ready. They must be kept moist.

Cottage Cheese Sandwiches.

Moisten cream cheese with cream and add pepper and salt to taste, beating to a thick paste. Add chopped olives or English walnut meats and cover the thinly cut slices of bread with the mixture.

Chicken Salad.

Cut boiled chicken into small dice.

With two cups of this meat mix a cup of celery cut into dice. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Into three tablespoonfuls of salad oil stir a tablespoon of vinegar. Line a chilled bowl with crisp lettuce leaves, fill with the chicken salad, and pour mayonnaise dressing over all.

Apple and Nut Salad.

Scoop the insides from fine, smooth, tart apples and fill with a mixture of cut celery and walnut meats blanched and chopped, the whole well moistened with mayonnaise. Slices of pippins are sometimes mixed with water cress and covered with French dressing, making a piquant salad that is especially good with roast duck.

Apple and Celery Salad.

Cut enough crisp celery into small bits to make a cupful. Lay in iced water. Peel and cut four large apples into small dice, dropping these into water as you do so. Drain the celery and sprinkle it with salt. Drain the apples, mix with the celery, and pour over all a thick mayonnaise dressing.

Sporting News

ROUSH OF REDS
LEADING BATTERS OF
NATIONAL LEAGUE

Stuffy McInnis of Athletics Topping
American League—Ty Cobb's Per-
centage is .350.

Chicago, April 28.—With twenty hits, four of them three-baggers, to his credit, in twelve games, Roush, of Cincinnati, is out in front for batting honors in the National League, according to unofficial averages. Jack Smith, of St. Louis, and Griffith, of Cincinnati, however, who have played in fewer games than Roush, are batting .667 and .500 respectively. New York is leading in club batting with .290, and Chicago in fielding with .971.

In the American League, Speaker, of Cleveland, continues in the lead, with an average of .429, although W. Johnson of Philadelphia, and Ruml, of St. Louis, pinch hitters, batted .600 and .500 respectively, in five games. Speaker has played in twelve, going to bat 42 times. Cobb of Detroit in 40 trips to the plate is batting .350. Philadelphia and Boston, with a percentage of .252, are tied for the lead in club batting.

Later Dope.

Figuring on all the games played in the American League up to Sunday, "Stuffy" McInnis of the Mackmen is leading the batters who taken part in at least ten games, his average being .404. Speaker, of the Cleveland team, is next with .400, having made 20 base hits in 50 times at bat. Cobb has an average of .326.

SNODGRASS GETS HIS
RELEASE FROM BOSTON

Boston, April 30.—Fred C. Snodgrass, outfielder of the Boston Nationals, has been given his unconditional release, it was announced at the club's office yesterday.

Snodgrass came to the Braves from the New York Nationals in 1915. His contract, which called for six thousand dollars a year, it is said, expired this year, and rather than sign at a lower figure he decided to go into business in Los Angeles.

BANGOR TO HAVE BIG
RACE MEET IN AUTUMN

Bangor, Me., April 29.—Early closing races for the Bangor Fair and Horse Show, which succeeds the Eastern Maine Fair, under the management of a new local syndicate, will be free-for-all, 2.14 pace, 2.16 pace, 2-8 pace, 3-minute pace for Maine horses, 2.16 trot, 2.19 trot, 2.23 trot, 2.28 trot, 3-minute trot for Maine horses. The most of the purses will be \$500, with \$800 for the free-for-all. The date is Aug. 27-Sept. 8. Early entries close May 21.

PAT DOHERTY OF
SYDNEY ARRIVES TO
TRAIN THREE HORSES

Veteran Horseman Came in Last Night
---Alverton Boy, Pearl Bourbon
And a Green One to Train Here.

Pat Doherty, the veteran horseman of Sydney, N. S., arrived in Fredericton last night and registered at the Barker House. Mr. Doherty will train his horses on the Fredericton track, as he has done before. He has three which he intends to race during the season of 1917. They are Alverton Boy and Pearl Bourbon, which have been here before, and a green one which he recently imported from Indiana.

Sydney newspapers have stated that there is a possibility of Mr. Doherty racing in the Province of Quebec.

There also is a possibility of him racing his horses in northern Maine, Northern Maine Circuit.

Letters from horsemen in Aroostook county state that a circuit composed of Houlton, Caribou, Presque Isle and Fort Fairfield is practically assured. In that case the majority of the horses from the Maritime Provinces will be seen up there as there is little prospect of anything in the Maritime Provinces. A large number of good horses have gone into Aroostook county lately, some of the money made out of potatoes having been converted into horse flesh.

THIRD TRIP TO MAJORS

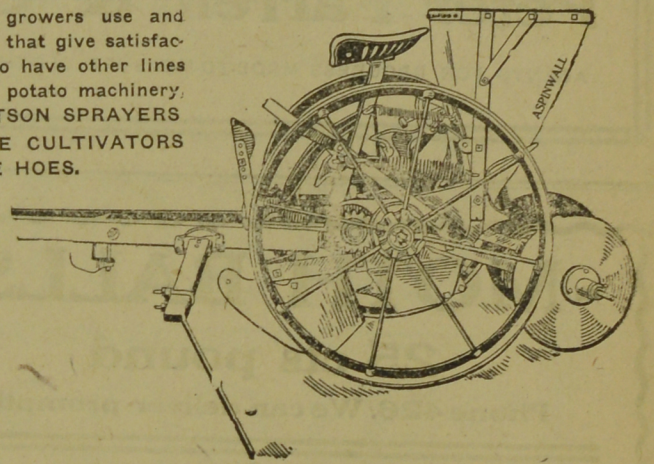
