Toronto, Nov. 19. — It was estimat ed at midnight last night that the \$100,000,000 mark had been passed in the Victory Loan campaign. At Dominion headquarters incomplete re- Under the Auspices of the Women's ports showed a total of \$95,343,600 but the unreported subscriptions would bring the actual figures for the first week well in advance of the century mark. Some of the provinces have re ported for only three or four days. Ontario with \$54,957,100 is the only one officially covered by full returns up to Saturday night.

#### Notice of Compulsory Vaccination.

The Fredericton Board of Health, District No. 1, having been ordered by the Provincial Board of Health, under the provisions of Section 39 of the Public Health Act 1911 to enforce compulsory vaccination for smallpox, all residents of the City of Fredericton, over the age of four (4) years, who have not been vaccinated within 5 years of November 1st, 1917, must be vaccinated on or before Friday, the by years of November 1st, 1917, must be vaccinated on or before Friday, the 30th day of November next, unless physically unfit, and submitting the Certificate of a duly qualified physi-cian to that effect.
