He appeared before Judge Lancelot, pleaded not guilty, and was given his freedom on \$500 bail. Bernier is the sixth of the anti-conscriptionists to be arrested here.

Montreal, Sept. 22.—R. C. Smith, K. C., one of the leaders of the Montreal bar, died early this morning. About a week ago he contracted a chill playing golf, and pneumonia developed.

Mr. Smith was prominent in many parts. He was a prominent Liberal and at one time successfully contested St. Antoine division against Sir Herbert Ames. He was head of the firm of Smith, Markey, Skinner and Pugsley. Mr. Smith was born in 1859.
