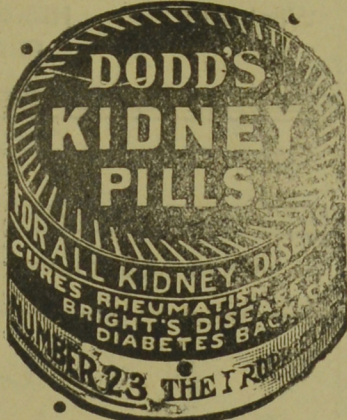

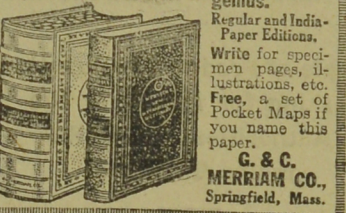

Breeder Hydgree, White Wyandottes**SOME GOOD RECEIPES****Marguerite Pudding.**Take one egg, its weight in fresh  
butter, flour and bread crumbs, one ta-  
blespoonful of jam, one of marmalade  
half a teaspoonful carbonate of soda.  
Beat well the egg, add the dissolved  
butter and crumbs, flour, jam and mar-  
malade, and the soda last of all, stir-  
ring briskly. Butter a basin, pour in  
the mixture, tie it down with the but-  
tered paper and steam for an hour and  
a half, turn out and serve with sweet  
sauce.**Veal Balls.**Eight ounces of cold cooked veal,  
three ounces of bacon fried, two table-  
spoonfuls of cream, three ounces of  
grated roll, one tablespoonful of chop-  
ped parsley, pepper and salt. Pass the  
meat and bacon twice through the  
mincing machine. Stir grated roll into  
cream, add egg, salt, pepper and pars-  
ley and, lastly, the meat, mixing all  
thoroughly. Form into balls the size  
of a nut, boil for five minutes in soup  
and serve hot.**Hickory Nut Cake.**Beat one small cupful butter and one  
and one-half cupfuls sugar to a cream.  
Flavor and add yolks of three eggs.  
Work through a sieve one teaspoonful  
baking powder and three cupfuls flour.  
Mix with other ingredients. Add slowly  
one cupful milk and one cupful wal-  
nuts, chopped fine, then the beaten  
whites of three eggs. Bake about  
three quarters of an hour in pans lined  
with greased paper.**The Great American Salad.**Every country has its favorite salad,  
or combination of uncooked green  
vegetables served with an oily or  
spiced sauce.Most foreign salads carry a tang of  
onions, leeks or garlic, flavors not  
much approved by the American  
palate.Consequently, when Oscar, famous  
chef of New York's famous hostelry,  
the Waldorf, combined the two Ameri-  
can staples, apples and celery, in a  
salad, the mixture was taken up by  
every cook in the land, and in a few  
years became the great American  
salad.The proportions used by Oscar for  
Waldorf salad are equal parts of cel-  
ery and apple cut in small cubes or  
pieces, and served in the hollow of a  
leaf of lettuce with a mayonnaise  
dressing. Too much dressing should  
be avoided.This makes a most wholesome and  
yet an inexpensive salad for either  
formal service or for the home dinner  
table. When a richer and more elab-  
orate salad is desired, black walnuts,  
another typical American product, may  
be added.**Fish Salad.**Use canned fish or any cold cooked  
fish with 1 cupful of cold rice, 1 cup-  
ful of celery, 1 cupful of mayonnaise,  
1 tablespoonful of onion juice, 2  
tablespoonfuls of finely cut parsley,  
peppers or olives, 4 cupfuls of lettuce.Mix the rice, celery, half the mayon-  
naise and the onion juice together.  
Serve on the lettuce with the fish in  
the centre with the rest of the mayon-  
naise. Garnish with tomato jelly
