EXPLOSIONS IN GERMANY

London, Dec. 16.—Two disasters in
widely separated parts of Germany
are reported in Zurich despatches re-
ceived here today. An explosion oc-
curred in Zeppelin works at Fried-
richshaven an resulted in the death or
injury of many. The second explosion
occurred near Kiel, destroying a fac-
tory where bombs were prepared for
Zeppelins and airplanes. Many of the
employees in this plant were killed.
