Y THAT CHINA IS BEING COERCED

Pekin, March 12.—A message sent by Dr. Sun Yat Sen to Premier Lloyd George, urging English officials to cease striving to induce China to join the Entente, has been widely published in China.

The Chinese newspapers attack the message as ridiculous, and ridicule Dr. Sun Yat Sen's suggestion that if China threw in her lot with the Allies it might provoke another Boxer uprising with a massacre of foreigners and create dissension among the members of the entente.

The newspapers deny that China is being coerced by England, and declare that Dr. Sun Yat Sen is unwarranted in an assertion he makes that a Mohammedan uprising is possible. They condemn the radical leader as a trouble maker.

PROMINENT MEN PLEDGE THEIR SUPPORT

New York, March 12.—Governors Edge, of New Jersey, and Holcomb, of Connecticut, former President T. Roosevelt, Assistant Secretary of the Navy Roosevelt, Major General Leonard Wood, Elihu Root, J. P. Morgan, Mayor Mitchell, W. Murray Crane, Robt. Bacon and others of prominence attended a dinner given here last night by Cornelius N. Bliss, at which they pledged themselves to support the national administration in any measures that may become necessary for the protection of American interests and the honor of the flag in the present international crisis.

MYSTERIOUS TRUNK ON BOARD STEAMER

London, March 13.—The story of a mysterious trunk which was on board the Frederick VIII., the steamer which brought Count Von Bernstorff from the United States to Copenhagen, is given prominence by the Daily Express. The trunk is said to have been consigned to Stockholm by the Swedish minister to the United States, and to have borne the seal of the Swedish consulate in New York.

The story says that the trunk was held at Halifax because its seals had been broken and that it will be sent to England by a British warship. After it reaches the British capital it will be turned over to the Swedish legation where its contents will be examined in the presence of British officials. The Express suggests that the trunk was opened between New York and Halifax to permit the insertion of secret documents belonging to Count Von Bernstorff.

unswerving integrity of purpose that Your Honor has ever displayed and which have earned the great respect we entertain for you, sir, there are qualities of heart possessed by Your Honor, evidenced by an amiability of character and kindness of disposition towards your fellow man which have won our affections and cause us to look upon you as our beloved Chief Justice.

It is therefore with no small degree of satisfaction and pleasure that the members of your bar learn that the attainments Your Honor has exhibited in your long career in the profession, at the bar and upon the bench, have received this distinguished recognition from the Crown.

You have been preceded, sir, in the dignified position you now occupy as Chief Justice of this court by a number of very talented men, whose memory will ever be preserved in the history and reports of the court, and by the portraits which adorn the walls of this room.

We are happy to assure you that the name and fame of Sir Ezekiel McLeod will always be treasured by the living members of the bar and will be handed down to posterity together with the excellent portrait of Your Honor which we are so glad now to have upon our walls as that of one of the great Chief Justices of New Brunswick.

In conclusion, I wish to express the sincere hope entertained by us all that your life will be long spared for the enjoyment of your knightly honors, and that the evening of your life, as it approaches may be made happy, as it should be, by reflection upon a long life of arduous labors well performed.

The Reply of Sir Ezekiel.

Sir Ezekiel, replying briefly to the address of Mr. Gregory, thanked him for the kind wishes extended from the bar of the Province of New Brunswick to himself. His relations with the bar had always been of the best. This was a proper condition of affairs, as when the bench and the bar do not co-operate the cause of justice suffers. Reference had been made to the fact that he was approaching the evening of his life, and the hope had been expressed that that evening he passed pleasantly. He knew himself, however, that already he had reached the evening of life. He was an old man and it could not be expected that he would much longer take part in the affairs of life. Sir Ezekiel closed his remarks with an expression of the kindest feelings to the members of the bar.

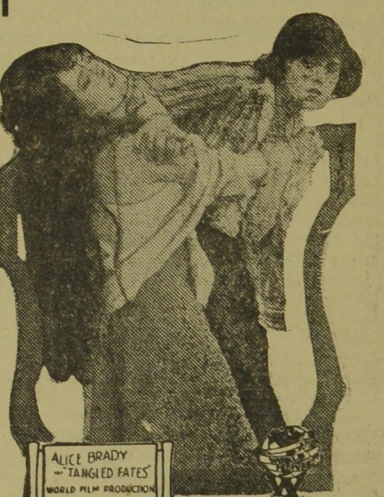
