## FRESH VENISON AT LOW PRICES

(Toronto Globe.)

Residents of Toronto who are suffering from the high cost of living are to have an opportunity to secure venison this autumn at reasonable prices. Property Commissioner Chisholm will shortly have twenty to thirty tons of this meat in the civic abattoir for distribution. The offer of the venison was made to the Board of Control in the following communication from Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, Minister of Lands, Forests and Mines:

"As you are doubtless aware, Algonquin Park, which is a large forest reservation, owned by the province, is also a splendid game preserve. Owing to the fact that no hunting is allowed in the park, it provides a safe retreat for all kinds of game, which enables them to feed and propagate without molestation. It is necessary periodically to thin out the number of deer in the park. Herebefore the department has disposed of the carcasses in the open market. Owing to the excessive cost of living at the present time, and the anxiety of this government to contribute in every possible manner to ameliorate this condition, it is felt that this venison should be handled in such a way that will contribute most towards a cheaper food supply. It seems obvious that this can best be done through the municipal channels.

"My suggestion, therefore, is that I will undertake to furnish the city of Toronto, at 10 cents per pound, with from 400 to 600 carcasses of venison, if you will undertake the distribution of the same in some manner which will most effectually achieve

## U.S. PICKET BOAT LOST WITH CREW

Washington, Nov. 3.—The Navy Department has been advised that a picket boat of an American battleship in home waters has foundered and its crew of twelve men are missing.

The navy department statement is as follows:

"On Oct. 30 the picket boat of the U. S. S. Michigan foundered. The finding of the bodies of three of the crew and the failure to find any other trace of the boat or its occupants, leads the department to believe all were lost."

## HUNS SURPRISED OVER VICTORY

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

Geneva, Switz., Nov. 3. — Swiss soldiers stationed on the Alpine heights on the frontier in the Canton of Grisons report that since the Germans captured Udine, the number of troop trains going in the direction of Trent has been doubled. The Swiss troops say that when heavy artillery trains are passing the Germans make smoke curtains at exposed points to prevent the number of guns being ascertained by onlookers.

The Swiss soldiers declare there is every evidence that the Germans were surprised by their success against the Italians, but intend to take every advantage of the situation and are preparing to entrench on the Tagliamento, as they did on the Marne in event of a failure in their forward movement.

## NEW TYPE OF GERMAN BOAT

London, Nov. 3.—An attack was made today on British vessels patrolling the Belgian coast by an electrically controlled high speed boat. The boat was destroyed, says an official statement. The term "electrically controlled" may mean that the boat is of a new type, without crew, and controlled from the shore by an electric device.

### CAPT. PAPINEAU KILLED.

Grandson of Rebel and Cousin of Henri Bourassa Dies for Empire.

Montreal, Nov. 3.—Private advices received in Montreal announce the death in action of Captain Talbot Papineau, of the original Princess Patricia's Regiment. He was a grandson of Louis Joseph Papineau, who took a leading part in the disturbances in Quebec of 1837. He was also a cousin of Henri Bourassa.

## GERMAN WORD FOR TANK

Thirty-five letters are required to spell the one word which, in German, is the equivalent of the four letter English "Tank," or land battleship, which has worked such havoc in the present war.

The German word is "Schutzengrabenvernichtungsmittel," which according to translation is "A machine for suppressing shooting trenches."


